Carnival Calabar: Diaspora Band Debuts 2nd Dry Run

he Governor of Cross River State,
Senator Prince Bassey Edet Otu, represented by Deputy Governor, Rt. Hon. Peter Odey, has officially integrated the Carnival Calabar Diaspora Band into the Carnival

Calabar family during the 2nd dry run held at the Millennium Park, Calabar, with the theme "An Epic Journey Through Time," marking a major milestone in the festival's 20th anniversary celebration.

Speaking at the ceremony, the Governor hailed the Carnival Calabar as a globally recognised cultural phenomenon, saying the inclusion of the Carnival Calabar Diaspora Band







reflects the administration's commitment to reconnecting Cross Riverians around the world with the State's cultural and

tourism identity.
"The world has
embraced Carnival
Calabar as a lifechanging
concept.Carnival
Calabar has
become part of our

history and legacy, and it will remain with us for the rest of our lives," he said.

Governor Otu added that



integrating the Diaspora Band is a significant step in strengthening the bond between **Cross River State** and our citizens worldwide. "This administration is committed to ensuring that our Diaspora is not just watching from afar but fully represented in the story we tell as we mark 20 years of Carnival Calabar. Today's

unveiling of the 20th anniversary mascot reaffirms our vision of a Carnival that is inclusive, global, and culturally grounded," he further noted.

The Chairman of the Carnival Commission, Sir Dr.Gabe Onah, highlighted the significance of the recent homecoming of over 92 Diaspora returnees, who acted as organic tourists during homecoming reconciliation visits.Dr Onah explained that these returnees brought back the culture, experiences, and knowledge they had acquired abroad to share with their homeland, reinforcing Cross River's global cultural connections.

"The Diaspora Band is one of the most recent additions to the history of the Carnival, For 20 years, we have built a cultural brand that has travelled the world, and now the world is returning home to take its place in the parade. This integration aligns with the Governor's directive to deepen diaspora participation, expand cultural exchange, and tell a more complete Cross River story, one that includes our people at home and our people across continents," he said.

Speaking on the development, Chairman of the Cross River State

Diaspora Commission, Prince Otu Okor, expressed gratitude to Governor Otu for his support for the initiative, calling the integration of the Diaspora Band a major milestone in the State's cultural diplomacy and diaspora engagement efforts.

"This integration gives our diaspora a real place in the carnival story. It shows that Cross Riverians abroad are not just visitors but contributors to our cultural identity," he said.

One of the visiting Diasporans, Dr Valerie O'Neal from Trinidad and Tobago, participated in the unveiling ceremony and expressed excitement at the

growing cultural bridge between Cross River and the global community.

Commissioner for Programmes Development and Events at CRIDCOM, Evang. Mrs Margaret Inde, PhD, also shared her thoughts on the significance of the Diaspora Band.

"We at CRIDCOM are proud to lead initiatives that connect our people across the globe and showcase the richness of Cross River culture. This band ensures our diaspora is part of the story," she said.









Gov Otu Splashes N86m on C'River Cocoa Estate Landlord Communities

n a major boost to agrarian host communities and in fulfilment of a long-standing promise, Governor Bassey Otu has approved the payment of N86 million in royalties to cocoa landlord communities in

Etung, an unprecedented intervention described as the largest single payout in the history of the state's cocoa administration.

The breakthrough was announced on Thursday, during a

high-level meeting between state government officials and representatives of cocoa landlord communities, held at the Traditional Rulers Council Chambers in Calabar.



Addressing journalists after the meeting, Secretary to the State Government, Prof. Anthony Owan Enoh, said the engagement became necessary to harmonize positions on the sharing formula for the newly approved funds.

"We've never had N20 million in the history of cocoa in Etung," he noted. "But for the first time, the government approved N86 million."

Prof. Enoh explained that the magnitude of the amount triggered questions about the size of land contributed by each community to cocoa production. To ensure an equitable distribution, he revealed that the government has constituted a committee for the eight officially recognized cocoa landlord communities to verify land contributions and other related claims.

"Every community brings forward the volume of land contributed to the government. That will now give a sharing formula for the money," he added.

Commissioner for Agriculture and Irrigation Development, Hon. Johnson Ebokpo, appealed for cooperation from the affected communities, assuring that the committee's work would be

transparent, inclusive and fair.

The Paramount
Ruler of Etung
Local Government
Area, HRM NtuiAtue, Anthony
Ntui-Etta, lauded
the initiative and
urged community
members to guard
against any form of
division over the
funds.

"We have settled ourselves and agreed that this royalty shouldn't bring disunity among us," he said.

While acknowledging outstanding arrears inherited from previous administrations, the monarch expressed gratitude for Governor Otu's resolve to deliver on his word. "During the campaign, he

promised us he's going to pay and he has done it," he stated.

Secretary of the landlord communities, Barr. Hollis Bassey Isong, described the governor's action as magnanimous and unprecedented, noting that no administration before now had released such a large sum to cocoa landlord communities.

The secretary of the verification committee and Special Adviser to the Governor on Asset Management and Recovery, Barr. Gilbert Agbor, assured that the committee would complete its work within two weeks as directed.

He added that the Otu administration

intends to sustain royalty payments. "His Excellency said it's a season of sweetness. Give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar," he remarked.

The committee is chaired by Dr. Odey Ikongha, Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Irrigation Development, with membership drawn from the eight cocoa landlord communities.

Thursday's meeting also had in attendance the Special Adviser to the Governor on Chieftaincy Affairs, Sir Francis Edet, senior government officials and other representatives from the landlord communities.

Gov Otu Unveils Carnival Calabar 20th Anniversary Mascot



ross River State governor, Senator Bassey Edet Otu has officially unveiled the 2025 Carnival Mascot and the newly established Carnival Calabar Diaspora Band.

The unveiling

which was
performed by the
Deputy Governor,
Rt. Hon. Peter Odey,
took place during
the Second Dry Run,
held at the popular
Eleven Eleven
Roundabout.
Calabar Cenotaph.

Speaking on behalf of the Governor, the

Deputy Governor described the unveiling as a symbolic and historic milestone that reinforces the cultural and tourism heritage of Cross River State. He emphasized that the new mascot captures the essence of the

20-year journey of Carnival Calabar, an event that has grown into one of Africa's most celebrated cultural showcases.

Highlighting the significance of the new emblem, the Deputy Governor explained that Governor Otu had earlier approved the creation of a mascot that reflects the beauty, growth, and resilience of the carnival.

"With great honour, and on behalf of the Governor of Cross River State, the Sweet Prince of Africa, Senator Prince Bassey Otu, we unveil this landmark design prepared to mark the 20th anniversary of Carnival Calabar," he proclaimed.
"Carnival Calabar

has become part of our identity, part of our history, and it will remain with us for generations. To the glory of God and the good people of Cross River State, we unveil this icon in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit."

Additionally, there was the unveiling of the Carnival Calabar Diaspora Band, a special ensemble designed to reconnect Africans in the diaspora with their ancestral home by the Deputy Governor.

He noted that the administration has continued to deepen engagement with the diaspora community through the State Diaspora Commission, an initiative that has already recorded meaningful progress.

He said for two decades, Carnival Calabar has functioned as a global cultural bridge, showcasing the creativity, unity, and tourism potential of Cross River State to the world.

Also speaking at the event, the Chairman of the Cross River Carnival Commission, Mr. Gabe Onah, described the celebration as a tribute to the state's enduring cultural identity. "This is our state, the Pearl of the South," he said. "Today we are witnessing the unveiling of another icon of our collective effort over these 20 years. Though it is a 20-year road march, the heritage



belongs to Cross River State. Our culture is the engine of our tourism, and this year's celebration stands as a testimony."

He recalled the October homecoming of 92 brothers and sisters from the African diaspora who visited the state on a reconciliation and heritage tour, an experience that further inspired the creation of the Diaspora Band.

According to him, the Governor approved the band to provide a platform for Africans in the diaspora to tell their own story through culture, rhythm, and artistic expression.

With the 2025
Carnival theme,
"Traces of Time," the
Diaspora Band will
join the procession
with a sub-theme
that reflects shared
history, collective
memory, and the
desire for cultural
reconnection.

"This is the epic journey through time," he said. "The Diaspora Band speaks to a shared history, to the pain we seek to reconcile, and to the future we are building together. I call on all diasporans around the world, including myself, to join the Diaspora Band and help lead Carnival Calabar into its next phase."

CRGIA Partners Cocoa-Coffee and Oil Palm Multi-Stakeholders Committee on Traceability Development

As Agency Allocates Office Space to Committee

he Cross River Geographic Information Agency (CRGIA) has formed a strategic partnership with the Cocoa-Coffee and Oil Palm Multi-Stakeholders Committee to enhance traceability systems for key agricultural value chains in the state.

The partnership was formalized during a high-level meeting between the Agency's management and members of the committee.

Speaking at the meeting, CRGIA's Director General, Mr. William Archibong, described the collaboration as a

significant step towards improving data accuracy and accountability in the agricultural sector. He noted that the forthcoming traceability system will ensure that stakeholders, particularly producers of major cash crops, have access to reliable information regarding





farmlands, farm owners, intermediaries, extension service providers, transportation channels, and the income generated from agricultural produce.

In his remarks,
Director of
Operations, Mr.
Jesam Iwara
reiterated that the
Geographic
Information System
(GIS) managed by

CRGIA serves as the state's central geographic data bank and will be utilized to support traceability activities. He emphasized that through bestpractice data management systems, the Agency is committed to ensuring full ownership of the state's geographic data.

Iwara added that the partnership will

enhance monitoring of actors and activities within cash crop value chains, ultimately improving the certification and profitability of the state's agricultural products.

He encouraged farmers to obtain Certificates of Occupancy to secure their farmlands and enhance their



eligibility for government support.

Dr. Edet Otu, CRGIA's technical adviser, presented a demonstration of GIS integration in agricultural value chain management and traceability. He highlighted how accurate data storage and controlled access within CRGIA will improve the identification of farm owners, processing and holding facilities, farm locations, crop types, farm sizes, road

networks, and local government jurisdictions.

Responding on behalf of the committee, Prof.
Damian Agom, Vice Chairman of the Cocoa-Coffee and Oil Palm Multi-Stakeholders Committee, expressed enthusiasm for the innovations introduced by CRGIA.

He commended the Agency for expanding its services into agricultural information systems

capable of providing the traceability data needed for state certification processes. According to him, these advancements will enhance the value of cash crops and boost financial inflow for farmers.

The event concluded with the symbolic handover of office keys for the Cross River Traceability Office at CRGIA.

he Cross River State **Emergency** Management Agency (SEMA), in collaboration with the National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA), has inaugurated Local **Emergency** Management Committees (LEMCs) across the Northern and Central Senatorial Districts of the State.

The inauguration

ceremonies, held in Ogoja and Ikom respectively, were part of ongoing efforts to strengthen grassroots disaster preparedness and response mechanisms across all local government areas of the State.

In Ogoja, the event took place at the Local Government Council Hall and covered five local government areas -Ogoja, Obudu, Yala, Bekwarra, and Obanliku.

The Ikom ceremony, held at the Ikom Council Hall, brought together representatives from Ikom, Abi, Boki, Etung, Obubra, and Yakurr Local Government Areas.

Speaking during the inauguration, the Director General of SEMA, Mr. Antigha Edem Gill, highlighted the critical role of local emergency



committees in early disaster response and coordination.

He explained that the establishment of the committees is backed by law, and their effectiveness depends on collaboration among local authorities and relevant stakeholders.

Mr. Gill charged the Vice Chairmen, who serve as heads of the local emergency committees, to work in harmony with their respective
Chairmen, noting that
effective cooperation
was essential for
timely and
coordinated
responses to
emergencies.

He assured that SEMA would continue engaging local government Chairmen to address administrative concerns and ensure smooth committee operations.

The Head of Operations of NEMA

for Cross River and Akwa Ibom States, Mrs. Mmandu Aisueni, commended the initiative, describing it as a major step toward improving interagency collaboration and strengthening local capacity for disaster management.

She emphasized that emergency management goes beyond the distribution of relief materials and requires proactive






engagement with communities and institutions to mitigate risks.







PRESS STATEMENT

ILLEGAL OPERATIONS OF LOTTERY AND GAMING BUSINESSES IN CROSS RIVER STATE

The attention of the Government of Cross River State has been drawn to the illegal and deceptive operations of some Lotteries and Gaming Companies and Organisations in Cross River State without proper registration and authorisation from the Cross River State Lotteries and Gaming Agency established by Law No 3. of 2024.

These illicit operations being perpetrated by some Lotteries and Gaming businesses, both those with physical office addresses and those operating online, are a flagrant violations of the Supreme Court Judgement of 22nd November, 2024 which nullified the National Lotteries Act 145 Laws of the Federation of Nigeria 2005 and vested the regulatory powers over Lotteries and Gaming businesses on States of the Federation of Nigeria.

The Government of Cross River State wishes to restate categorically here that by the Cross River State Lotteries and Gaming Law assented to by His Excellency, Governor Bassey Edet Otu on the 12th of May, 2025, only the Cross River State Lotteries and Gaming Agency is vested with powers to issue Licences and regulate Lotteries and Gaming businesses and Services in any part of the State, be it a physical office or online.

For the avoidance of any doubt, these Lotteries and Gaming activities include Online Sports Betting, Casino Games, Public Online Lotteries, Pools Betting, Raffle Draws, Scratch Cards, Interactive Games and any other game of chance where a stake and potential winning is involved.

Government hereby enjoins all Radio and Television Stations operating in the State to please liaise effectively with the Advertising Regulatory Council of Nigeria (ARCON), the Cross River State Signage and Advertising Agency (CRISSAA) to demand for the Agency's Operational Permit before accepting to publicize their businesses on air as paid advertisements.

Finally, the Government sincerely appreciates and thanks all Lotteries and Gaming Companies and Organisations that have complied with the Law and solicits the understanding and cooperation of all concerned while also making it clear that violators/defaulters shall face the full wrath of the law.

1. Applications are invited from eligible Nigerians for commission into the Nigerian Army (NA) as Short Service Combatant Commission (SSCC) officers. The SSCC application is open to both civilians and serving military personnel with appropriate qualifications. On completion of training and when commissioned as officers, the SSCC officers would serve only in the Combat Arms (Infantry and Armour Corps) and Combat Support Arms (Artillery, Engineers, Signals and Intelligence Corps) of the Nigerian Army.

Entry Requirements

- 2. All applicants must satisfy the following conditions:
- a. Be a citizen of Nigeria by birth, as defined in the Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria 1999 (as amended).
- b. Be a male or female between the ages of 23 and 27 by 9 January 2026.
- c. Be medically, mentally and physically fit according to Nigerian Army Standards.
- d. Civilian applicants must be recommended and attested to his/her good character by at least 2 recognizable referees who are either a Local Government Chairman/Secretary or an officer of the Armed Forces not below the rank of a Lieutenant Colonel and equivalent/Assistant Commissioner of Police who must hail from the applicant's state of origin. Passport photographs of referees must be affixed to the letter of attestation.
- e. Candidates must submit a Letter of Attestation from their former institutions.
- f. Measure in height at least 1.68m (for male) and 1.65m (for female).
- g. Must not have been convicted by any court of law. Military personnel must not have any disciplinary case and must be endorsed by the Commanding Officer/Commander.
- h. Possess at least a first degree with not less than Second Class Lower Division or HND of not less than Lower Credit in the arts, sciences or humanities from

accredited university or institution of higher learning. Courses of study must also be accredited at the time of study.

- i. Possess valid birth certificate endorsed by the National Population Commission, Hospital or Local Government Council or valid age declaration.
- j. Possess a valid certificate of state of origin.
- k. Applicants (other than serving members of the Armed Forces) must possess NYSC discharge certificate or a valid certificate of exemption.
- I. Only tertiary academic credentials obtained from Year 2017 to date will be considered.
- m. Applicants must present valid contact addresses and telephone numbers of parent/guardians and Next of Kin.
- n. Candidates must not have any body inscriptions or tattoos.
- o. Candidates must tender all original copies of educational certificates (primary to tertiary).
- p. Service personnel must present valid military identity cards and letters of recommendations by their Commanding Officers/Commanders. They must also present valid letter(s) of official sponsorship in tertiary academic institutions. Additionally, they must have served for a minimum period of 5 years in the Armed Forces of Nigeria. All Service personnel applicants are under obligation to declare their Service status on application as required by Harmonised Terms and Conditions of Service for the Armed Forces of Nigeria. Failing to do so constitutes an offence in addition to disqualification at any stage.
- q. Candidates must not be members of any cult/secret society/fraternity.
- r. Candidates must not have been dismissed or withdrawn on disciplinary grounds from any military or para-military training institutions.

Conditions of Service

3. SSCC will be granted for 15 years. Ten years will be on the active list (Initial bonding period) renewable thereafter for a period not more than 5 years. No extension shall be granted after the fifteenth year of commission except on conversion to regular combatant commission where applicable.

- a. Officer cadets who successfully complete the military training shall be granted the rank of second lieutenant with seniority effective date of commencement of cadet training.
- b. SSC officers shall have the privilege to convert to Regular Combatant Commission, however, it is not automatic. It is based on availability of vacancy and other criteria that are or will be in force from time to time.
- c. All graduating officer cadets must sign an acceptance of the terms and conditions governing the SSCC before they are granted commission into the Nigerian Army.
- d. The reckonable period of service for civilians who become commissioned officers will be based on the date of commencement of cadet training while that of military personnel applicants would be effective date of enlistment.


