C'River Assembly Urges State Gov't to Relocate Calabar Suya Arcade to Zoo Garden

he Cross
River State
House of
Assembly has
called on the State
Government to
urgently relocate
the Calabar Suya
Arcade from
Bogobri to the Zoo
Garden, citing

congestion, health concerns, and the need for a more organized business environment.

The motion, sponsored by Hon. Stanley Nsemo, member representing Calabar Municipality, received the unanimous support of all members of the House.

Presenting the motion, Hon. Nsemo recalled that the Calabar Suya Arcade was established during the administration of former Governor Liyel Imoke as part of efforts to strengthen the state's image as a leading tourism hub. The arcade was created as a central point where suya vendors could operate in an organized setting while maintaining Calabar's reputation as one of Nigeria's cleanest and

greenest cities.

He noted that the arcade has, over the years, helped regulate indiscriminate suya-selling activities across the metropolis, serving both residents and tourists who frequent the popular spot.

However, Hon. Nsemo raised concerns about the rapid increase in the number of vendors and visitors, which has led to congestion and obstructed traffic flow in the area. He added that the environment has deteriorated due to the lack of sufficient space and proper wastedisposal channels, making the location increasingly unsafe and unhygienic.

Members agreed that relocating the arcade to the Zoo Garden would provide a more spacious and suitable environment for vendors and customers. The proposed site also offers adequate parking space, which is currently lacking at the Bogobri location.

After deliberations, the House resolved that the State Government should, as a matter of urgency, relocate the Calabar Suya Arcade to the Zoo Garden to ensure better organization, improved hygiene, and a safer commercial atmosphere for both sellers and patrons.

In his remark, the Speaker of the House, Rt. Hon. Elvert Ayambem,

commended the initiative, describing the motion as timely and essential for ensuring a cleaner, safer, and more organized Calabar. He noted that the Suva Arcade has served the city well over the years, but the current challenges demand proactive action to protect public health, strengthen security, and enhance the state's tourism appeal.

He emphasized that relocating the arcade to the Zoo Garden would not only improve traffic flow and sanitation but also provide a more secure and conducive environment for businesses to thrive.

NACA DG lauds Gov Otu's HIV Response efforts ...as FG site three Oxygen Plants in the State

irector-General of the National Agency for the Control of AIDS (NACA), Dr. Temitope Ilori, , has lauded Cross River State Governor Bassey Otu for his strategic initiatives in combating HIV/AIDS in the

State.

The DG gave the commendation during an interactive meeting with Implementing Partners, Civil Society Organizations, and other stakeholders held at the Cross River State Agency for the Control of

AIDS (CR-SACA) in Calabar.

Dr. Ilori expressed appreciation for the integration of individuals living with HIV/AIDS into the State's Health Insurance Scheme but emphasized that the local production of ARVs must adhere to



proper certification standards.

She stated, "We are pleased with Governor Otu's relentless efforts in preventing the spread of HIV/AIDS, especially his policy to include people living with AIDS in the Health Insurance Scheme, which provides them a sense of belonging."

She also acknowledged the contributions of the Governor's wife, Bishop Eyoanwan Otu and Dr. Charles Iwara, DG of CR-SACA, highlighting their collective impact on infrastructure and response activities.

In response to funding cuts, she disclosed that President Bola Ahmed Tinubu had approved USD 200 million to maintain service continuity for essential health commodities, adding

that with global support, NACA has established an operational 10,000liter oxygen plant at the University of Calabar Teaching Hospital with three other plants sited in Ikom and Ogoja to ensure that the State is fully covered for all forms of emergency situations.

Dr. Ilori also announced plans by the Federal Government to



produce ARVs and other essential commodities locally by early 2026, ensuring sustainability in the fight against HIV/AIDS.

The DG disclosed that the World AIDS Day 2025 will focus on sustaining national responses amid disruptions, reinforcing the need for government investment at all levels.

Earlier, in his welcome, the Director-General, **Cross River State** Agency for the Control of AIDS (CR-SACA), expressed gratitude to the Federal Government for its contributions to mitigate the impact of dwindling funds.

He assured the NACA DG that the Governor Bassey Otu-led administration is working tirelessly to ensure that citizens

receive care and treatment, with the goal of eliminating new infections.

While calling on the Federal Government to support the State with commodity provisions, the DG also thanked **Implementing** Partners (IPs) for their steadfast support and Civil Society **Organizations** (CSOs) and Faith-Based **Organizations**



(FBOs) for their partnership and collaboration, which has made Cross River State a safer place in the pursuit of zero new infections by 2030.

Also speaking on behalf of Implementing partners, State Coordinator of the Excellence Community Education Welfare Scheme (ECEWS), Mr. Uwana acknowledged the supportive environment created by the State, noting their operations in 64 facilities and reaching over 38,000 individuals with treatment.

The DG later performed a symbolic inauguration of a condom dispenser unit mounted at the entrance of CR-SACA

which is also strategically placed across the metropolis and urged the target population to utilize the free services which she noted is part of effort to prevent the spread of HIV in the State.

Gov Otu Cancels 2025 Agbokim Marathon, Vows Stronger Return





ross River State **d**governor, **Senator Bassey** Edet Otu, has directed the cancellation of the 2025 Agbokim Waterfalls Green Marathon, following what he described as the "prevailing national security realities" requiring cautious action and responsible planning.

Announcing the decision, the Secretary to the

Government of the State, Prof. Anthony Owan Enoh, said the Governor considered it necessary to halt this year's edition to ensure the event is properly fortified in future. "His Excellency believes the marathon deserves comprehensive, multidimensional support, and that requires adequate preparation," he stated.

Prof. Enoh explained that the government is committed to

enhancing the event's long-term value, noting that security considerations must take precedence. "The safety of participants, organisers and spectators remains paramount," he said.

Governor Otu expressed regret over the inconvenience the cancellation may cause athletes, partners and organisers who had

invested time and resources. "We deeply appreciate their enthusiasm and understanding at this time," the SSG added.

He also assured that the marathon will re-emerge stronger and more prestigious.
"Subsequent
editions will carry
the unmistakable
signature of Cross
River excellence,"
the statement
quoted the Governor
as saying.

According to him, the State

Government is determined to elevate the Agbokim Waterfalls Green Marathon into "an event of national pride and global attention" once all necessary structures are in place.

PRESS STATEMENT

ILLEGAL OPERATIONS OF LOTTERY AND GAMING BUSINESSES IN CROSS RIVER STATE

The attention of the Government of Cross River State has been drawn to the illegal and deceptive operations of some Lotteries and Gaming Companies and Organisations in Cross River State without proper registration and authorisation from the Cross River State Lotteries and Gaming Agency established by Law No 3. of 2024.

These illicit operations being perpetrated by some Lotteries and Gaming businesses, both those with physical office addresses and those operating online, are a flagrant violations of the Supreme Court Judgement of 22nd November, 2024 which nullified the National Lotteries Act 145 Laws of the Federation of Nigeria 2005 and vested the regulatory powers over Lotteries and Gaming businesses on States of the Federation of Nigeria.

The Government of Cross River State wishes to restate categorically here that by the Cross River State Lotteries and Gaming Law assented to by His Excellency, Governor Bassey Edet Otu on the 12th of May, 2025, only the Cross River State Lotteries and Gaming Agency is vested with powers to issue Licences and regulate Lotteries and Gaming businesses and Services in any part of the State, be it a physical office or online.

For the avoidance of any doubt, these Lotteries and Gaming activities include Online Sports Betting, Casino Games, Public Online Lotteries, Pools Betting, Raffle Draws, Scratch Cards, Interactive Games and any other game of chance where a stake and potential winning is involved.

Government hereby enjoins all Radio and Television Stations operating in the State to please liaise effectively with the Advertising Regulatory Council of Nigeria (ARCON), the Cross River State Signage and Advertising Agency (CRISSAA) to demand for the Agency's Operational Permit before accepting to publicize their businesses on air as paid advertisements.

Finally, the Government sincerely appreciates and thanks all Lotteries and Gaming Companies and Organisations that have complied with the Law and solicits the understanding and cooperation of all concerned while also making it clear that violators/defaulters shall face the full wrath of the law.
