

C'River Heightens Sanitary Measures Ahead of Calabar Carnival, Yuletide Celebrations

...Orders Closure of Eight Miles Roadside Markets




s part of preparations for the Yuletide celebrations and Carnival Calabar 2025, the Cross River State Government, through the Ministry of

Environment, has intensified sanitary measures across the state.

This was disclosed during the November edition of the statewide environmental sanitation exercise

in Calabar.
According to the
Commissioner for
Environment, Hon.
Moses Osogi, 'it
has become
imperative to
upscale sanitation
due to the
expected influx of
tourists who will



troop into the state for the festive season".

Hon. Osogi noted that the ministry is working tirelessly to ensure that tourists and visitors enjoy the serene and clean environment for which the state is known.

At the Eight Miles Flyover, the Commissioner ordered the closure of roadside markets, insisting on the need for a free flow of human and vehicular traffic along major streets in the metropolis. He explained that indiscriminate trading on pedestrian



walkways not only obstructs movement but also constitutes an environmental nuisance.

The Commissioner also expressed displeasure over environmental violations and poor sanitary conditions at the abattoir in Marian. During his inspection of the

slaughterhouse, he described the environment as unhealthy for both workers and consumers of its products. He queried the management for their non compliance with sanitation regulations.

Osogi further noted that the November sanitation exercise

marks the last for the year 2025, but assured that other environmental activities such as: desilting of drainages, waste evacuation, and pruning of worn out trees will continue to maintain the state's clean status.

The Commissioner led the



Environmental Task Force, ministry staff, NGOs, volunteers, and security personnel through major streets in Calabar, arresting offenders and impounding vehicles belonging

to sanitation defaulters.

In separate interviews, some residents expressed appreciation for the government's efforts to improve the living conditions of

citizens.

At the time of filing this report, defaulters were being tried at the state's mobile courts.



CRSMEDA Boost Cross River Economy With 500 MSMES To Receive Single-digit Loans, 1,000 Get Free CAC Certificates



he Cross
River State
Microfinance
and Enterprise
Development
Agency (CRSMEDA)
has announced a
significant
milestone in its
effort to stimulate
the state's
economy,
confirming the

imminent disbursement of single-digit interest loans to 500 prequalified Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs).

This initiative, part of the joint CRSG/SMEDAN Loan Facility, underscores

the State
Government's
commitment to
empowering the
private sector,
recognised as the
second-highest
employer of labor.

Following a highimpact "Access to Finance Engagement"



session, CRSMEDA confirmed its readiness to facilitate the loans. The facility features an exceptionally attractive 5% interest rate and a three-month moratorium, making capital highly accessible to small businesses across the state.

Mr. Great Ogban , the Director-General/CEO of CRSMEDA, stated,
"We are all but
ready for the
disbursement. This
facility is designed
to be supportive and
accessible, reflecting
Governor Bassey
Otu's unwavering
commitment to
economic
expansion."

He emphasized that the 500 beneficiaries were selected after a rigorous statewide verification process, including enterprise development training and physical business premises assessments. To maintain eligibility, beneficiaries with outstanding loans in other financial institutions were strictly advised to clear their backlogs immediately.

In a further demonstration of government







support, One Thousand (1,000) business owners were presented with their free Corporate Affairs Commission (CAC) certificates during the event. This critical intervention, sponsored by the State Government, aims to regularise and formalise the operations of nano and microenterprises, facilitating their

transition into the formal economy.

Mr. Ogban hinted at plans for a massive scale-up of this formalization drive, announcing that the State is



preparing for another round of free CAC registration targeting Ten Thousand (10,000) small businesses next year. This is a strategic move to build a competitive and formalised private sector across Cross River State.

The business community has warmly received the initiative. Mr. Liyel Imoukhuede, Vice President of Business

Development &
MSME at the Calabar
Chamber of
Commerce, Industry,
Mines and
Agriculture
(CALCCIMA), praised
the government's
effort.

"This is a very novel event, and indeed Christmas for SMEs in Cross River State," Mr. Imoukhuede stated. "We have a Governor who is very intentional about growing the small business ecosystem. The

private sector is very supportive of this initiative."

CRSMEDA confirmed that its robust monitoring and evaluation framework is in place to track the utilisation and impact of the funds, ensuring the facility operates on a revolving structure over two to three years to benefit more entrepreneurs over time.





Some of the beneficiaries, including Alex Ego Oyama, Offiong Oku, and Lekam Abam Lekam, took

turns to hail the governor for the initiative and hinted that the loan would greatly enhance their businesses and

concluded by thanking the state government for investing in economic growth across the state



C'River Inaugurates CTRA Board, Charges Members to Sanitize Transport Sector

n a significant move to strengthen the State's transportation system, the Cross River State Government has inaugurated the Board Members of the Commercial Transport

Regulatory Agency (CTRA).

The oath taking ceremony, held at the Ministry of Transportation headquarters, was administered by Honourable Commissioner for Transportation,

Pastor Ekpenyong Cobham, who administered the oath of office and outlined a clear mandate for the new board.

Pastor Cobham emphasized the weight of responsibility



entrusted to the newly inaugurated members. He noted that their oath of office serves as a guiding principle for managing government policies, documents, and actions with integrity.

According to him, the primary focus

of the new board is to establish a robust operational foundation for the agency, which is essential for "sanitizing the entire ecosystem and addressing the impunity of commercial drivers" within the state.

A key directive for the board was to



implement the
State color scheme
for all intra-city
commercial
vehicles, specified
as blue and white,
reflecting the
state's unique
identity.

This policy aims to enhance uniformity, identification, and order in the public transport landscape.

The Commissioner highlighted the importance of fairness and service, stating

that every citizen deserves respect: "Every road user is the governor's person and should be treated fairly." This reinforces the government's commitment to citizen-focused governance and the protection of commuters' rights.

The newly inaugurated CTRA Board members are Mr. Efa Nyong - Chairman, CTRA, Mr. Ukpong Ukpong - Director, CTRA, Barr. Roseline Inameti -

Secretary, CTRA and Mr. Dominic Edem - Member, CTRA

The event was attended by Dr. Gabriel Ukwada, Permanent Secretary of the Ministry, along with other officials and stakeholders, highlighting a collective effort to achieve a more efficient, orderly, and safe transport sector for Cross River State.



World AIDS Day: CR-SACA Engages Muslim Community on HIV Prevention

he Cross River State Agency for the Control of AIDS (CR-SACA) organized a Jummat service at the Ikot Ansa Mosque in Calabar on Friday, as part of activities marking the2025 World AIDS Day.

In his sermon,
Imam Shileik
Ahamed Etim
Bassey focused on
HIV/AIDS
prevention,

clarifying that the disease is neither a result of witchcraft nor a punishment from God. He reminded the congregation that Islam encourages seeking medical treatment.

The Imam educated attendees on the various modes of HIV transmission and emphasized the need to avoid stigma and discrimination against

individuals living with the virus. He urged everyone to know their status by accessing HIV counseling and testing services at the Calabar Municipal ground during the Christmas village opening.

During an interactive session after the service, Dr. Charles Iwara, the Director General of CR-SACA,



represented by Monitoring and **Evaluation Officer** Mr. John Ekpeni, stressed the importance of HIV prevention, particularly through proper condom use. He explained that this engagement was a strategic effort to promote awareness about HIV prevention and safe sex practices among the Muslim community in Calabar.

The DG demonstrated correct condom usage and distributed them free of charge,
encouraging
attendees to use
them properly. He
urged the community
to prioritize family
safety over cultural or
religious
misconceptions
regarding HIV.

"The State

infections by 2030.
That's why we are
here today to create
awareness about
prevention," he
stated.

The agency's representative invited the Muslim

community to participate in upcoming World AIDS Day events, including a Candleliaht Memorial Service on Sunday at 5 PM and a World AIDS Day Awareness Walk on Monday, December 1, 2025, at Rabana Roundabout. He also encouraged them to visit the Wise-Up Calabar Festival pavilion at the Christmas Village for a wide range of healthcare services.







FG Partners with Save the Children and Global Partnership for Education to Enhance Education in Refugee Communities ...as Prof Odey Affirms C'River's Commitment

delivery in refugee and host communities across five beneficiary states: Adamawa, Akwa Ibom, Benue, Cross River, and Taraba.

This initiative focuses on training teachers, including

volunteers in crisis-affected areas, and has led to the construction of various educational facilities, such as classrooms, lavatories, and boreholes. Launched in 2024, the project targets out-of-



school children and is overseen by the High-Level **Project Technical** Committee and the National Steering Committee, chaired by Honourable Minister of **Education Maruf** Olatunji Alausa. Stakeholders have praised the program's impact.

During a National Project Steering Committee meeting in Abuja, members reviewed progress and discussed sustainability strategies, emphasizing the consolidation of teacher training, infrastructure expansion, and state-level project ownership.

Cross River State's

Commissioner for Education, Senator Professor Stephen Odey, reaffirmed the State's commitment, highlighting Governor Senator Prince Bassey Edet Otu's support for educational transformation.



Senior Secondary Board Conducts On-the-spot Assessment Of Schools Across Calabar Metropolis

n line with the People First agenda of the **Cross River State** Government, the Chairman of the **Senior Secondary Education Board** (SSEB), Dr. Anthony Ngban, alongside Board members, embarked on an unscheduled visit to secondary schools across the state from November 24 to 27.

The team included Permanent Secretary Dr. Ekei Okon, Board Members Miss Essieanwan ESO Archibong and Mrs. Agube Ignatius, and Board Secretary Mr. Lawrence Nsa.

Schools visited included Government Secondary School Adiabo Okurikang in Odukpani Local

Government Area, Army Day Secondary School Ikot Ansa, Government Girls' Secondary School Big Qua Town, and Pinn Margaret Secondary School, Calabar.

The visit aimed to conduct a comprehensive needs assessment, ensuring compliance with state education





standards and evaluating the conditions of facilities in use. The inspection team focused on academic administration, staff conduct, learning environments, and student welfare.

Dr. Ngban emphasized the Board's commitment to accountability and



transparency, noting that absenteeism without proper permission warrants disciplinary action. He highlighted issues of truancy and misconduct observed during visits, stressing the need for adherence to approved guidelines.

At Government Secondary School Adiabo, students were seen loitering, prompting urgent attention from the team. The Chairman expressed disappointment at the absence of Principal Mr. Etu James Effiong during the visit. **Interactions** revealed issues like inaccurate

enrollment figures and lack of a class timetable.

The Principal
thanked the team
for their









assessment, emphasizing its importance in resolving academic issues.

At Government Girls' Secondary School, Dr. Ngban acknowledged the teachers' efforts and assured that recruitment for science teachers would soon be addressed. Teachers expressed gratitude for the team's visit and appealed for new hires to fill vacancies.

The visit concluded at Pinn Margaret Secondary School, where the commitment of Principal Mrs. Agnes Bassey and her teachers was praised. The

inspection featured interactive sessions on record-keeping and student academic work, led by the Board's disciplinary committee members and directors.

NORTHFEST Technical Committee Concludes Review Conference, Unveils 5-Year Agro-Development Masterplan

he Technical Working Committee (TWC) of Northern **Cross River** Agricultural and **Cultural Festival** (NORTHFEST), has concluded a highlevel, two-day strategy review meeting outlining an ambitious fiveyear (2026-2030) development strategy masterplan aimed at revolutionizing the agricultural sector of the Northern Senatorial District.

The event which was held at the State Library Complex in Calabar, between November 25th and 26th, 2025, brought together representatives of

government MDAs, financial institutions, stakeholders and other interested parties to develop a comprehensive policy framework that moves NORTHFEST beyond an annual festival to a long-term, commercial agricultural initiative.

Ntufam Fidelis Ugbo, Chairman of the Technical Working Committee (TWC), emphasized that the primary goal of the collaboration is to structure a five-year masterplan that will empower local farmers and significantly improve yield and farm produce quality.

Ntufam Ugbo said the Committee plans to provide key inputs supply, credit facilities and help to create guaranteed markets for farmers' products offtake, ultimately transforming Cross River State into a nationally recognized cultural food hub.
"The gathering is

"The gathering is to further provide opportunities for collaboration with farmers, through a more structured financing system," Ugbo stated.

Speaking at the opening ceremony on Tuesday, Dr. Peter Ojie, Secretary of the TWC, stressed the importance of public-private collaboration, particularly with financial and

private sector entities, to drive the agrarian component of NORTHFEST using agriculture as the economic mainstay of Northern Cross River.

Dr. Ojie disclosed that a crucial part of the strategy involves securing legal frameworks for the festival, which will ensure official government gazetting. He noted that the initiative aims to celebrate the culture, while establishing agriculture as a sustainable commercial identity of the people.

Mr. Attah Joseph, lead Consultant from Plum Horizon Ltd, Abuja, provided the technical context for the meeting. He explained that the five-year roadmap is designed to

transition the region "from being just for subsistence farming to commercial agriculture." Accordingly, the plan involves interfacing with funding agencies and partners, connecting government MDAs for the seamless execution and providing credit facilities and seedlings for staple food products.

Ultimately, the program seeks to transform NORTHFEST into a nationally recognized festival and cultural food hub through systematic expansion of agribusiness, providing access to credit, and developing an extensive agro value chain.

The Committee received significant

contributions and recommendations from key entities, such as the Cross River State Ministries of Livestock Development, Environment, Culture and Tourism, and Agriculture. These recommendations focused on addressing challenges and ensuring the project's continuity towards strong Ministries/LGAs partnership at the community level, creating an investor-ready integrated structure and a clear agricultural roadmap.

The gathering was graced by numerous dignitaries and representatives from both the public and financial sectors, notably Dr.

STEPS TO OBTAIN CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY IN CROSS RIVER STATE

Obtain an Application Form at CRGIA's Office, Old Secretariat Road, Off Murtala Mohammed Highway, Calabar, Cross River State

Submit Application Form with Required Documents
Fill and submit the form along with necessary documents,
e.g. Registered Title Document, survey plan, identification, etc.

Assessment and Payment of Fees.
The office will assess applicable charges, registration fees, processing fees, etc. Make the required payment.

Inspection and Publication (for private land)
Property is inspected by LUAC officials
Notice of application is published for 21 days to allow for objections.
After clearance, Governor's Approval in Principle is obtained.

C of O (Certificate of Occupancy) Engrossment and Signing The Certificate of Occupancy is prepared (engrossed) and signed by the Governor or delegated authority.

Registration and Delivery
Final registration is completed at the Lands Registry.
Registered documents are delivered to the applicant (client).
