PRESS STATEMENT
CROSS RIVER WILL RECOVER ALL OIL WELLS
LOST AND MORE

Cross River State Government had on 28th July, 2025 issued a Press Statement titled "RE:76 OIL WELLS, RESTATEMENT OF FACTS" where all the emerging facts regarding the surreptitious allocation of Cross River State 76 Oil Wells to Akwa Ibom State and all related matters thereto were clearly enunciated for public information.

In 2025 Cross River State petitioned the President and RMAFC, NBC, NUPRC and OSGOF with evidence of 245 new Oil Wells derivation allocation with a comprehensive scientific, geological and Legal EVIDENCE justifying Cross River State's Oil producing Status.

An Inter-Agency Committee was constituted by Mr. President and exercise conducted in November 2025 confirming additional Oil Wells derivation allocation for Cross River. The current Inter-Agency Committee opened a public hearing for the presentation of the report having shared the coordinates to both States.

The result is obvious, Cross River State is an Oil producing State with Oil Wells within its maritime territory beyond, 67 or 76 Oil Wells.

As at today, Cross River still maintains that position which necessitated the writing of the petition in the first Instance to the President, His Excellency, Asiwaju Bola Ahmed Tinubu, GCFR, over the injustice meted to us as a State.

We bore the brunt of handing over a part of Bakassi to the Republic of Cameroon all these years. It baffles our imagination how only a portion of Bakassi was ceded to Cameroon while the Oil Wells found their way to Akwa Ibom that was not part of the dispute in the first place.

Thanks to Mr. President, the Federal Government Inter-Agency Technical Committee was set up to look into the emerging matters.

Comprehensive visits, mappings and findings have been made to the area in dispute by all concerned and new discoveries have emerged in the area which was not demarcated, boundaries have been set between the Cross River State estuaries and the Cameroon.

Therefore, the Committee should be allowed to present their findings to show the actual location of the Oil wells within both States. Cross River State deplores every divisive plot to disrupt the conclusion of this findings, report and implementation.

We have absolute confidence in the joint Committee and urge them to remain resolute in rewriting the wrongs of the past.

Cross River State under the Administration of Sen. Prince Bassey Otu is governed by God. What is truly ours will be returned to us.

We are hopeful of getting back all our Oil Wells.

The Special Adviser on Non-Indigenes Affairs to Governor Bassey Otu of Cross River State, Mazi Okey Maduekwe has thrown his weight behind the Cross River State Government's

Maxi Okey also called for the full release of the 13% derivation fund from the oil wells which has accumulated over

the years.

Gov Otu Conferred with Honorary Doctorate by Modibbo Adama University



Cross River State governor, Senator Bassey Otu was weekend, conferred with an Honorary Doctorate by the Modibbo Adama University (MAU), Yola, in recognition of what the institution

described as his far-reaching contributions to governance, public service and humanitarian development across Nigeria.

The prestigious honour was conferred during its combined 29th and 30th convocation

ceremonies.

The conferment of the Doctor of Humanities (Honoris Causa) followed the collective approval of the University Senate and Governing Council, a decision described by the Vice-Chancellor,



Prof. Ibrahim Umar, as "a unanimous academic salute to a life of service defined by integrity, inclusion and measurable societal impact." According to him, "this honour is reserved for leaders whose influence transcends office and geography, touching lives and strengthening

institutions."

Prof. Umar noted that Governor Otu's public career exemplifies people-centred leadership and humane governance. "His approach to power has been guided by compassion and conscience," the Vice-Chancellor said. "Governor Otu has consistently demonstrated that




“I would be remiss if I departed this historic gathering without saluting my brother and friend, Professor Afolabi Ogufekun,”

Governor Otu declared. “I made it a personal duty to be here today, no matter the circumstances, because he is a man I hold in the highest esteem—both for the depth of his intellect and the strength of his character.”



The Cross River State Government through the Ministry of Water Resources, in a strategic partnership with the Rural Water Supply and Sanitation Agency (RUWATSSA), Self Help Africa (SHA), and the Society for Water and Sanitation (NEWSAN), has inaugurated the Obubra Local

Government Area Task Group on Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (LTG-WASH).

This initiative is designed to bolster governance and improve the delivery of essential services at the community level.

The inauguration took place during a comprehensive three-day institutional

strengthening exercise held at the Obubra Local Government Council Secretariat, weekend.

The event served as a platform for State officials, local leaders, and international development partners to align their efforts toward a common goal: ensuring that every



resident of Obubra has access to sustainable and safe water and sanitation facilities.

In his opening the ceremony, Dr. Okon Ita, Chairman of the State Task Group on Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (STG-

WASH), and Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Water Resources, emphasized that the move was a deliberate attempt at "system strengthening."

He pointed out that analyzing the LGA's current WASH status was

critical to identifying gaps, noting that no sustainable development can occur without the foundational oversight of a dedicated local task group.

Representing Dr. Ita, Engr. Eni Nkanu, a Director in the Ministry of



Water Resources, the PS called on the newly appointed members to serve with total commitment as WASH ambassadors in their domain.

He pledged the full support of the Ministry in making Obubra Open Defecation Free, vowing that the State would "leave no stone unturned" in its mission to upgrade the quality of public

health and hygiene infrastructure within the region.

In his welcome address, the Chairman of Obubra Local Government Area, Hon. Kingsley Arikpo, expressed deep appreciation for the State government's intervention.

Represented by Hon. James Ekoh, the Chairman described the inauguration as a "bold step" toward alleviating the challenges faced by

the people of Obubra, specifically highlighting the history of water-related health issues in the area.

A key highlight of the event was an in-depth overview of the WASH System for Health (WS4H) program. This four-year initiative, funded by the UK's Foreign, Commonwealth & Development Office (FCDO), is currently being implemented by Self Help Africa.

The programme is designed to build resilient systems that can withstand environmental and social challenges while remaining inclusive for all citizens.

Mr. Ferdinand Anok, the State Coordinator for Self Help Africa, who moderated the technical sessions, explained that the WS4H project operates in both Nigeria and Sierra Leone and that in Nigeria, the project focuses specifically on Kano and Cross River States, utilizing a deliberate "systems-first" approach to ensure that improvements in water and sanitation are permanent rather than temporary.

The inauguration marks a milestone in Cross River's broader strategy to institutionalize community-driven governance. By focusing on evidence-based planning, the state aims to meet universal access goals and significantly reduce the incidence of waterborne diseases like cholera, which has historically affected rural populations in the Obubra region.

As part of the three-day activities which commenced on January 27, 2026, the newly formed committee underwent a rigorous capacity assessment. This ensured that the members of the LTG-WASH and the Council's existing WASH department

are equipped with the technical knowledge and management skills required to oversee large-scale sanitation projects.

The newly inaugurated leadership of the Obubra LTG-WASH includes Mrs. Florence Asuk as Chairperson and Mr. Nyiam John as Co-chairperson. They are supported by a dedicated team comprising Otu Ekanem (Secretary), Mr. Oyom Ayang (Mobilization Officer), and Mr. Ovat Obo (Public Relations Officer), all of whom are tasked with driving the local hygiene agenda forward.

World NTD Day: C'River State Calls for Urgent Funding to Eradicate "Deadly but Preventable" Diseases

In a strategic move to combat Neglected Tropical Diseases (NTDs) in the State, the Cross River State Government has called on the Federal Government and international development partners to scale up funding and clinical action.

Speaking during a commemorative road walk to mark World NTD Day, in Calabar, Friday, the State Director of NTDs, Pastor Veronica Mark Onen, described the occasion as "historic," noting that awareness is the first line of defense against diseases that currently plague 16 out of the state's 18 Local

Government Areas.

Mrs Onen highlighted the gravity of the public health challenge, identifying four specific diseases that remain endemic across Cross River to include Onchocerciasis (River Blindness), Lymphatic Filariasis



(Elephantiasis), Schistosomiasis (Bilharzia) and Soil-Transmitted Helminthiasis (Intestinal Worms).

"Those of us that go on fieldwork can attest to the fact that almost

all the LGAs in the State are endemic to one of these diseases or another," Onen stated.

"We are joining the global community to create awareness about these deadly

but preventable diseases," She reiterated.

World Neglected Tropical Diseases Day is observed every year on 30 January. Neglected tropical diseases (NTDs) are a diverse group of conditions that still affect one billion people worldwide, primarily in vulnerable and underserved communities. Yet they are

preventable, treatable, and can be eliminated.

According to World Health Organization (WHO), in 2024, around 1.4 billion people required interventions against neglected tropical diseases, a 36% decrease from 2010. As of early 2026, 58 countries have successfully eliminated at least one NTD—demonstrating significant progress toward the WHO's global target of 100 countries reaching elimination by 2030.





The vaccination will take place at all health facilities, schools, mosques, churches, recreational centres, markets, palaces, motor-park, shopping malls and all places where eligible children can be found.

Routine vaccination continues after the campaign in all health facilities as health workers will be available at all designated posts in our various Communities. Don't wait or leave any child behind, visit your nearest health facility or any vaccination site nearest to you.



VAT ON BANKING FEES WAS NOT INTRODUCED BY THE NIGERIA TAX ACT


