Gov. Otu's Three Years Extraordinary, Cross River Recovering — Archbishop Bassey

"The Evidence Before Us: A Statement on the State of Cross River and Our Common Future," where he said his verdict was based on an examination of what the administration inherited, the resources available to it, accumulated liabilities, debt, revenue, infrastructure, asset recovery and emerging economic initiatives.

Territorial Archbishop of Calabar and Convener of the Cross River State Christian Leaders Forum, Archbishop Josef Bassey, has described Governor Bassey Edet Otu's three years in office as "absolutely

extraordinary", declaring that Cross River State is recovering from the deep fiscal, institutional and infrastructural challenges inherited in 2023.

Bassey made the assessment at a world press conference titled

He recalled that Cross River was handed over in May 2023 with a domestic debt of approximately N204.05 billion, substantial foreign-denominated obligations,

accumulated workers' and pension liabilities, promotion arrears and unpaid gratuities, while several public institutions and government assets had suffered years of deterioration. "We were in a deep pit. All the accounts of the state were in red with heavy debts on them," he said.

The Archbishop, however, noted that the state's domestic debt had declined to approximately N137.36 billion by December 2025 and N132.30 billion by March 2026, representing a reduction of about N71.7 billion from the June 2023 figure. He said the reduction was particularly significant given Cross River's

relatively limited fiscal resources and the difficult economic conditions under which the administration had operated.

He also pointed to growth in the state's internally generated revenue, noting that National Bureau of Statistics figures put Cross River's IGR at approximately N21.1 billion in 2022 and N31.56 billion in 2023, while state fiscal records subsequently reported about N46.3 billion in independent revenue for 2024. Bassey said the simultaneous rise in revenue capacity and decline in domestic debt was evidence of a positive fiscal direction, although he cautioned that the state still

carried substantial external obligations of about \$223 million as of the end of 2025.

Bassey particularly commended the recovery of Tinapa, describing it as an important asset of the state that had been lost to the Asset Management Corporation of Nigeria (AMCON) but was now back under Cross River's control. He, however, stressed that the facility must be made economically productive, warning that "recovery alone is not enough. Tinapa must now work."

He also highlighted the reconstruction and rehabilitation of major public assets, including

the Governor's Office, State Library, Cultural Centre Complex, government lodges, Local Government Service Commission and CICC facilities. According to him, restoring deteriorated public infrastructure may offer less political visibility than building new projects, but remains critical to recovering the state's institutional inheritance.

On workers' welfare, the Archbishop acknowledged progress in addressing inherited gratuity obligations, noting that no gratuity had been paid between 2009 and 2023, while payments had now been made up to

2015. He also commended efforts to rebuild the civil service through recruitment, promotions, training and digitisation, while stressing the need to restore merit, professionalism, institutional discipline and competence.

Bassey said the administration's emerging economic architecture, particularly initiatives in cocoa, coffee and oil palm, Project Grow, the Bakassi Deep Seaport, tourism and aviation infrastructure, as well as efforts to pursue Cross River's maritime and petroleum rights, could provide the foundation for sustained economic growth. He stressed that the deep seaport remained

unfinished but said the technical studies, regulatory processes, investment mobilisation, financing initiatives and evacuation-corridor planning were important steps that must now lead to execution.

He urged the government to move beyond recovery into aggressive development, noting that resources currently being expended on rebuilding collapsed institutions and settling inherited liabilities could eventually be redirected towards industries, innovation, education, healthcare and enterprise. According to him, "We have spent

three years buying back our past. Now, we must build our future.”

The Archbishop, however, called for a stronger government team as the administration enters its next phase, warning that some appointees lacked the competence and capacity required to translate the Governor’s vision into measurable results. He urged Governor Otu to prioritise character, competence, capacity, track record and execution in making strategic appointments, rather than political considerations.

Bassey also commended Governor Otu for

publicly identifying with God and dedicating Cross River State to God, saying this should translate into higher standards of justice, integrity, righteousness and responsible stewardship. He stressed that such a position did not exempt government from scrutiny but should strengthen its obligation to serve the people faithfully.

Declaring that his loyalty was to Cross River State rather than any government or political party, Bassey said he had applied the same standard to the Otu administration that he had applied to previous governments.

“Where government fails, I will speak. Where government succeeds, I will

acknowledge it. Where government must do more, I will demand it,” he said, adding that measured against what was inherited, the resources available and the prevailing economic circumstances, Otu’s three-year record was “absolutely extraordinary” and Cross River was steadily recovering.

Group Backs Gov. Otu, Nominates Ekpang to Advisory Council, Unveils “Complete the Eight”

Political advocacy group, CODE 888, has expressed support for the performance of Governor Bassey Edet Otu's administration, nominating the

Commissioner for Lands, Dr. Erasmus Ekpang, to its Advisory Council and unveiling plans for its “Complete the Eight Campaign” ahead of the 2027 political season.

The Director-General of the group, Engr. Maurice Nkong, disclosed this on Thursday when the organisation paid a courtesy visit to Erasmus Ekpang in his



office in Calabar, explaining that the engagement was aimed at formally introducing CODE 888 to the Commissioner, appreciating him for promptly responding to its request and seeking his participation in its activities.

Nkong said CODE 888 was established to

advocate equity, justice and fairness in the distribution of political opportunities across Cross River State, particularly in response to concerns over perceived imbalances in the rotation of political leadership among the state's senatorial districts.

He explained that the organisation

had over the years mobilised support around what it considered fairness and continuity in political representation, adding that the "Complete the Eight Campaign" would mobilise support for the continuation of the present administration based on its assessment of Governor Otu's



performance.

The group commended the Governor's interventions in security, infrastructure, healthcare, environmental sanitation, employment and other sectors. It particularly noted

improvements in security in Calabar and other parts of the state, as well as interventions in waste management, road construction and rehabilitation and primary healthcare.

A major highlight of the visit was the nomination of

Erasmus Ekpang to serve on CODE 888's Advisory Council. He was subsequently decorated with the group's regalia alongside other respected individuals expected to contribute their experience, guidance and



strategic counsel to the organisation.

The CODE 888 delegation expressed appreciation to the Commissioner, Permanent Secretary, Directors and staff of the Ministry for the warm reception. The group also commended Governor Otu for appointing what it described as competent leadership in the Ministry and

expressed confidence that the Commissioner's experience would add value to its Advisory Council.

The group reiterated its commitment to the principles of justice, fairness and equity, while preparing for its activities and the "Complete the Eight Campaign" ahead of the 2027 political season.

Responding, Dr. Erasmus Ekpang thanked the leadership and

members of CODE 888 for the visit and the confidence reposed in him, describing his nomination to the Advisory Council as an honour and assuring the group of his willingness to provide appropriate guidance and support within the limits of his responsibilities.

The Commissioner also acknowledged the leadership of Governor Otu, highlighting the administration's



extensive road construction and rehabilitation projects, efforts to strengthen healthcare facilities and recruit health personnel, as well as initiatives in environmental sanitation, diaspora engagement and the revitalisation of government-owned media and printing institutions.

Speaking on the Ministry of Lands, Dr. Erasmus Ekpang stressed the importance of

responsible land administration and effective development control, noting that proper assessment of land, soil composition and the suitability of sites for different categories of development were essential to preventing avoidable disasters and ensuring sustainable urban development.

He called for stronger collaboration among professionals and relevant authorities

to ensure that developments comply with approved standards, stressing that development control must be guided by technical competence, professionalism and the public interest. He also assured the delegation that his doors remained open to stakeholders seeking appropriate guidance and support.

UNICROSS HODs Tasked to Raise Standards, Drive University's Transformation

The Vice Chancellor of the University of Cross River State (UNICROSS), Prof. Francisca Bassey, has tasked Heads of Departments (HODs) with raising academic standards, upholding

discipline and driving the University's transformation through hard work, accountability and commitment to excellence.

Prof. Bassey gave the charge, Thursday, during an interactive meeting with

HODs at the Conference Room of her office, providing a platform for Management and academic leaders to deliberate on institutional responsibilities, challenges and strategies for improving academic



administration and the overall development of the University.

Commending the HODs for their dedication, the Vice Chancellor urged them to remain focused on their responsibilities and work collectively towards building a stronger institution. Drawing

inspiration from the Bible, she said, "There is nothing impossible to him that believeth. When you focus your eyes on what you want to achieve, you can achieve it despite the obstacles. If we have that mindset we can achieve the best for UNICROSS."

She stressed that genuine dedication to duty and

commitment to students and the development of Cross River State would attract recognition and opportunities for staff. "God rewards hard work. If you do well, you will be called for positions you did not lobby for. If you have the interest of these children and Cross River State at heart, God will

call you to reward you. Just do your work. The blessings will come," she said.

Prof. Bassey specifically urged the HODs to take ownership of the University's transformation, declaring, "Let's play our parts to build UNICROSS. Together we can change the narrative and we will change the narrative."

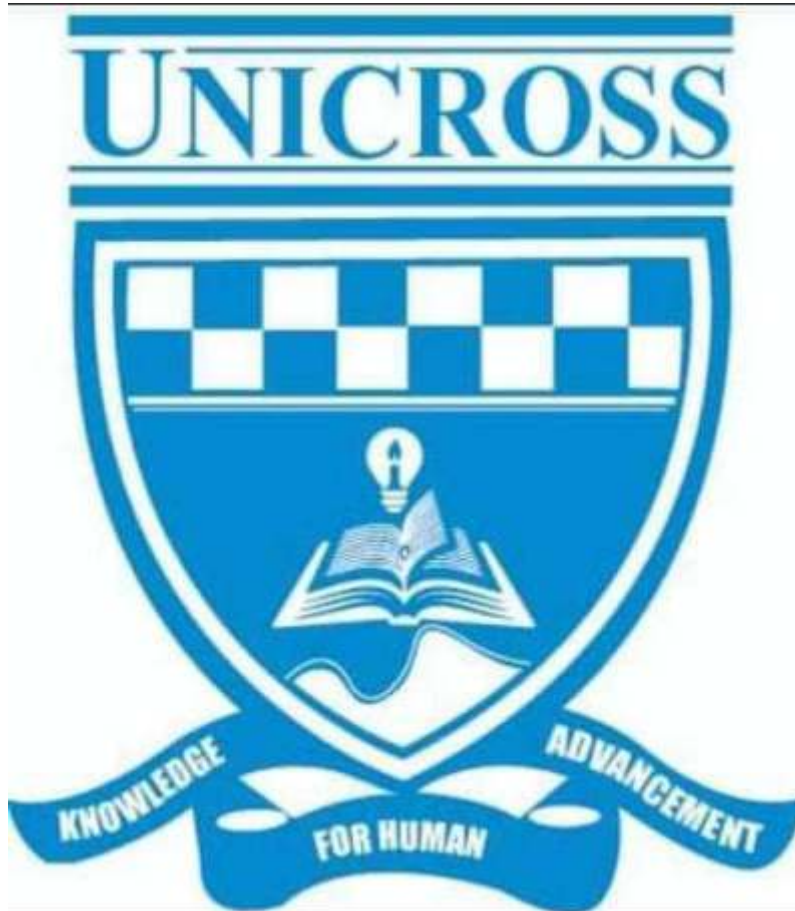
She announced that the University would expand opportunities for staff training and exchange programmes,

while encouraging staff members to pursue personal development and continuously improve their professional capacity. "We are

On infrastructure, the Vice Chancellor assured the HODs that bad roads within some parts of the University's campuses would be addressed, stressing UNICROSS's strategic responsibility for producing the

The Vice Chancellor emphasised the need for due process and adherence to the University's

organogram in addressing grievances and resolving institutional concerns. She assured the HODs of Management's commitment to maintaining a harmonious working environment, stressing, "We are a family."

Also speaking, the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academic), Prof. Stella Maris-Okey, reminded the HODs of their responsibilities and urged them to ensure the prompt uploading of students' results as part of efforts to strengthen academic administration.

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Otu's Performance, Strongest Case for Second Term — Ekpenyong

The Director-General of Neighbour2Neighbour Grassroots

Network, Dr. Bobby Ekpenyong, has described Governor Bassey Edet Otu's performance in

office as the strongest justification for his re-election in 2027, saying the

Governor deserves a second term to consolidate the development gains recorded across Cross River State.

Ekpenyong said the Otu administration had, in the last three years, demonstrated commitment to improving security, infrastructure, workers' welfare, agriculture and the state's investment climate, arguing that continuity was necessary to sustain the momentum.

He said one of the administration's major achievements was the creation of a relatively safe environment for residents, businesses and investors, describing Cross River as a security

model whose architecture had attracted attention from other states.

"Is Cross River State safe under Senator Bassey Edet Otu? The answer is a resounding yes. Cross River State is a security model state where other governors are tapping into the security architecture and techniques that the Governor has deployed to provide the safe society we now enjoy," Ekpenyong said.

He also cited the regular payment of workers' salaries and the resumption of employment into the state civil service after more than a decade as evidence of the administration's commitment to the welfare of Cross Riverians.

According to him, the return of investors and increased economic activities across the state were further indications that the Otu administration was creating an environment conducive to business growth.

"Investors have returned to Cross River State. Businesses are flourishing. Look at nightlife, hospitality, entertainment and transportation," he said.

Ekpenyong said the Governor's engagements outside the state and country had also contributed to efforts to attract investment, stressing that Cross River could not develop major

projects solely with its limited financial resources.

He pointed to opportunities around the Bakassi Deep Seaport and new oil frontiers as examples of areas where external investment and partnerships were required, arguing that Governor Otu's international engagements were part of his efforts to connect the state to the global investment community.

"We want a governor who has the connections and capacity to link Cross River State to the world," he said.

The Neighbour2Neighbour DG also highlighted the administration's infrastructure

programme, particularly the simultaneous construction of roads across the three senatorial districts, as evidence of a broad-based development strategy.

"Road construction is going on across the three senatorial districts simultaneously. It has never happened before in the history of governance in Cross River State," Ekpenyong said.

He further praised the administration's investment in agriculture and support for farmers, saying the sector remained critical to strengthening the state's economy and improving the livelihoods of rural communities.

Ekpenyong also said

Governor Otu's political experience and record of public service had positioned him to effectively manage the affairs of the state, recalling his empowerment initiatives during his time in the House of Representatives.

"He has the pedigree and antecedents of performance right from when he was in the House of Representatives. He introduced empowerment, empowering people. That's what endeared Cross Riverians, who are not even from his political divide, to vote overwhelmingly for him," he said.

He said his assessment of the Governor's popularity was

reinforced by his interactions with residents across the state through the Neighbour2Neighbour Grassroots Network, claiming that the feedback from communities showed strong support for Otu's second-term bid.

"The people of Cross River State are overwhelmingly behind the Senator

Bassey Edet Otu-led government. They are very ready to vote for Governor Otu," Ekpenyong said.

He urged Cross Riverians to support the Governor's re-election in 2027, arguing that a second term would give the administration the opportunity to consolidate ongoing projects, attract more investment

and deepen its interventions across key sectors.

Ekpenyong maintained that Governor Otu's record, rather than political rhetoric, should form the basis of the 2027 decision, insisting that the administration's performance had provided a compelling case for continuity.

Biase VC Hails Gov. Otu's Sanitation Drive, Cites Journal Study on Improved Hygiene

The Vice Chairman of Biase Local Government Area, Hon. Chief Ekuma Ngwu, JP, has commended Governor Bassey Edet Otu's sanitation policies, saying they have yielded visible improvements in environmental hygiene and cleanliness across Cross River State.

Ngwu's assessment is contained in a recently published study titled "Assessment of Environmental Sanitation Practices in Calabar City, Cross River State, Nigeria," published

in the GUV Journal of Research and Development, which examined sanitation practices in Calabar metropolis and highlighted significant improvements in environmental cleanliness.

The study, authored by Ngwu, credited recent government initiatives, including the renewed monthly sanitation exercise, upgraded sanitation infrastructure and enhanced waste collection, with contributing to improved public health and the restoration of Calabar's reputation as one of Nigeria's cleanest urban centres.

According to the

findings, sanitation awareness among residents remains high, with 91 per cent of respondents actively participating in the monthly sanitation exercise. The study also identified effective waste management systems as an important factor in improving environmental hygiene within the metropolis.

Ngwu said the findings provided evidence of the impact of the state government's sustained attention to environmental sanitation, particularly under Governor Otu's administration. "The renewed commitment to environmental sanitation has produced visible results, and the gains recorded in

Calabar demonstrate what sustained government action and public participation can achieve," he said.

The Vice Chairman also commended the immediate past Commissioner for Environment, Mr. Moses Osogi, for his contribution to the progress, particularly through the enforcement of environmental laws and the establishment of structured waste management practices.

He called on the present Commissioner for Environment, Hon. Effiom Ekaha, to consolidate the achievements by strengthening sanitation enforcement and sustaining

initiatives that have improved environmental hygiene across the state.

Ngwu, however, said the study identified areas requiring further intervention, including improved sanitation infrastructure in local communities and stronger partnerships with private-sector organisations for the routine maintenance of public amenities.

He also advocated the deployment of modern waste-processing technologies to improve waste disposal, reduce the dumping of refuse in drainage channels and minimise environmental conditions that contribute to

severe flooding across the state.

The study further stressed the importance of sustained public participation in sanitation activities, noting that government efforts would have greater impact when residents, communities, businesses and other stakeholders take collective responsibility for maintaining clean and healthy environments.

Ngwu said environmental sanitation should be treated not only as an aesthetic concern but also as an important public-health and urban-development priority requiring sustained investment, effective infrastructure and

responsible citizen participation.

He expressed optimism that continued collaboration between government and stakeholders would help consolidate Cross River's reputation for environmental cleanliness while addressing emerging sanitation challenges in Calabar and other communities.

CRSMEDA Screens Insurance Firms to Protect MSMEs Against Disaster Losses

The Cross River State Microfinance and Enterprise Development Agency (CRSMEDA) has commenced a preliminary review of leading insurance companies operating in the state as part of

efforts to strengthen protection and financial resilience for Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs).

The initiative follows the recent devastating fire incident that destroyed several businesses in the

state, leaving affected entrepreneurs with significant financial losses and hardship.

Speaking on the development, the Director-General and Chief Executive Officer of CRSMEDA, Great Ogban, said



the evaluation formed part of the state government's broader commitment to protecting small businesses against unforeseen risks and ensuring their sustainability in the face of disasters.

Ogban explained that the agency

was assessing the insurance firms to identify underwriters capable of providing MSMEs with affordable, comprehensive and business-friendly insurance coverage.

He disclosed that eligible small businesses would be enrolled in

selected insurance schemes at no cost to the business owners, describing the intervention as a strategic safeguard designed to cushion entrepreneurs against losses arising from unforeseen incidents.



business owners and their employees.

The insurance companies currently being evaluated include Fortis Global Insurance (FGI), led by its Unit Manager, Anthonette Odey; Leadway Assurance, led by its Branch Manager, John Orisa; AXA Mansard, represented by its Business Development Lead, Ubong Edet; and International Energy Insurance (IEI) Plc, represented by its Head of Business Development, Cross River State, Grace Ikpa.

According to him, the screening process would consider the scope of coverage, affordability, responsiveness and the overall security guarantees offered by the respective insurance providers.

He said the initiative was particularly important given the vulnerability of small businesses to unexpected disasters, which could wipe out years of investment and threaten the livelihoods of

Ogban said CRSMEDA would select insurance providers whose policies offered the



strongest protection and were most responsive to the peculiar needs of MSMEs in the state.

He stressed that the initiative was aimed not only at responding to the consequences of recent disasters but also at establishing a sustainable risk-

management framework that would protect businesses from future shocks.

The CRSMEDA boss maintained that strengthening insurance protection for MSMEs would contribute to the stability of the state's enterprise ecosystem by helping affected businesses recover

faster whenever unforeseen incidents occur.

He said the intervention underscored the state government's commitment to creating a safer and more resilient environment for entrepreneurship, investment and sustainable business growth in Cross River State.

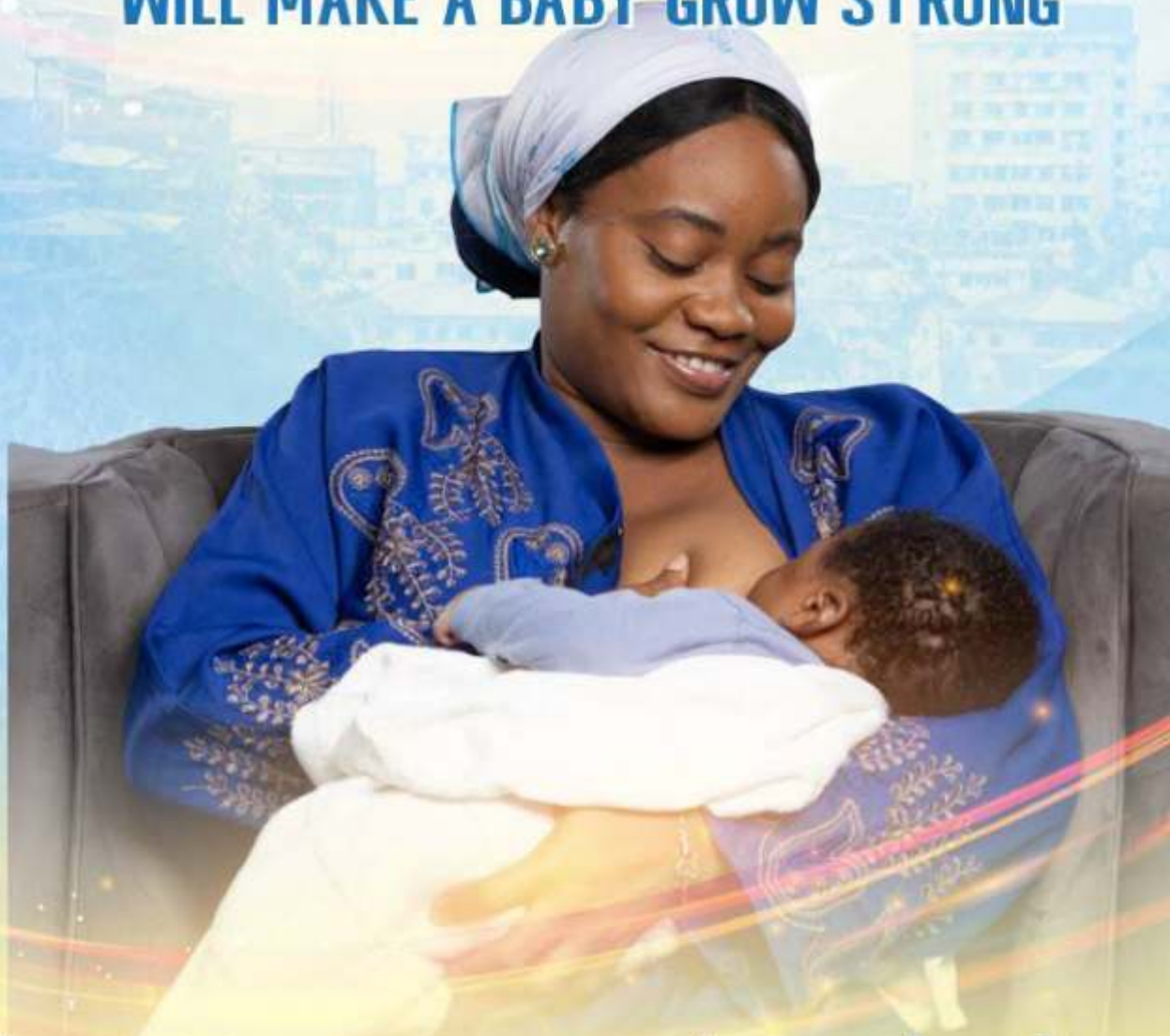

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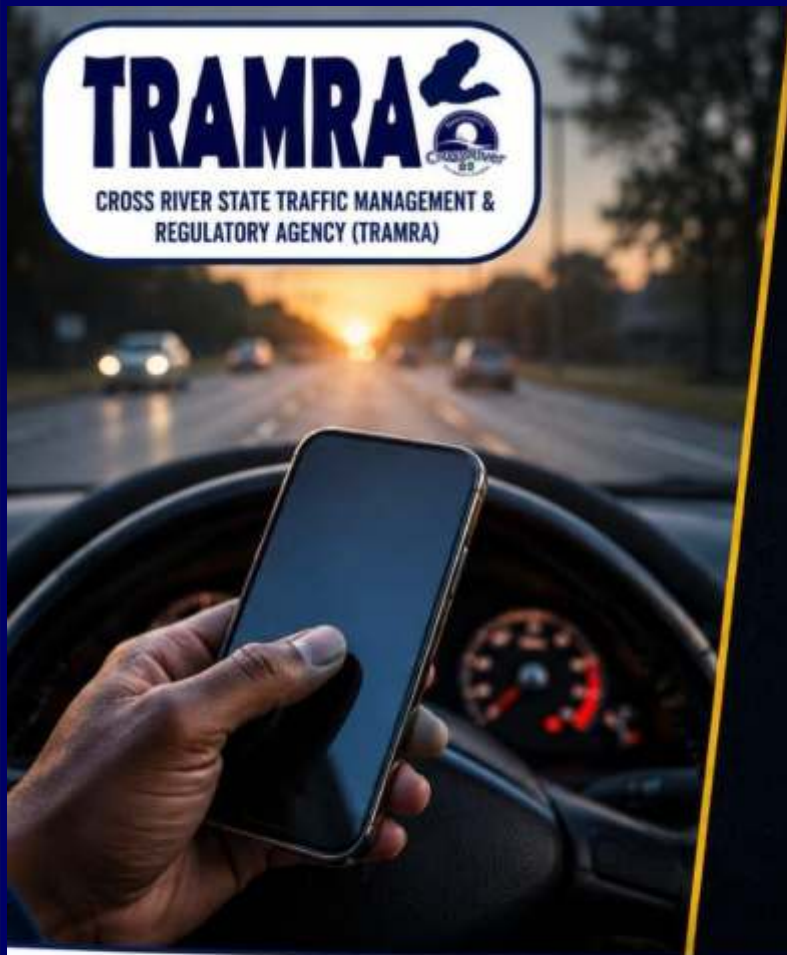

EXTENSION OF THE SUSPENSION OF ALL SCRAP-RELATED ACTIVITIES IN CROSS RIVER STATE

Further to the Press Release dated the 23rd of February 2026, communicating His Excellency, Senator Prince Bassey Edet Otu's approval of the suspension of all scrap-related activities, the Cross River State Government hereby notifies the general public that the suspension has been extended for a further period of one (1) month expiring on the 23rd August 2026.

As stated in the previous Press Release, the suspension was necessitated by the increasing incidents of vandalism, theft and destruction of public infrastructure by scavengers, scrap dealers and their agents, and the significant security threat posed to the State. This extension is intended to enable Government conclude the ongoing review of the laws, policies and regulatory framework governing scrap-related activities in Cross River State. The objective is to strengthen the regulatory regime, identify and protect legitimate operators, and implement measures that effectively prevent the infiltration of criminal elements into the sector.

Government regrets any inconvenience caused to legitimate businesses and law-abiding operators. However, the protection of public infrastructure, the preservation of public order and security remain paramount. Members of the general public are accordingly informed that the suspension remains in full force and that any person or organization found engaging in scrap-related activities in contravention of this directive shall be dealt with strictly in accordance with the law.

INFORMATION SECTOR

Gov. Otu: Repositioning Cross River's Information Sector for Transparency, Digital Governance, Global Visibility

Information is the lifeblood of governance. It shapes public perception, inspires confidence, preserves history and connects government with the governed. Recognising this reality, Governor Bassey

Edet Otu made the revitalisation of Cross River State's information ecosystem a strategic component of his People First Agenda, transforming what had long been regarded as a routine government communication apparatus



into a dynamic instrument for transparency, citizen engagement and institutional efficiency.

Three years into the administration, the information sector has emerged as one of the state's most improved sectors, recording remarkable progress in digital transformation, public communication, media relations, broadcasting, institutional strengthening and archival documentation. The reforms implemented between 2023 and 2026 have not only modernised government information management but have also significantly enhanced Cross River

State's visibility on the national and international stage.

Prior to 2023, many of the structures responsible for government information management had suffered years of neglect. Critical communication infrastructure was outdated, public engagement had diminished, digital platforms were inactive, and the Ministry of Information operated with severe manpower and technological limitations.

Governor Otu's administration responded with deliberate investments





aimed at rebuilding the Ministry into a modern public communication institution capable of meeting the demands of contemporary governance.

For the first time in well over a decade, the Ministry underwent comprehensive institutional revitalisation. Modern ICT equipment was procured, digital workflows introduced, and office operations significantly improved through technology-driven systems. Equally significant was the recruitment of 20 new personnel (information officers), ending a manpower deficit that had persisted for more than 13 years and injecting fresh capacity into government information management.

These reforms improved operational efficiency while

laying the foundation for a more responsive and professional information service.

Perhaps one of the administration's most visible achievements has been the deliberate repositioning of Cross River State within the national media landscape.

Under Governor Otu, the Commissioner for



Information maintained consistent appearances on leading national television networks including Channels Television, AIT, ARISE News, TVC, NTA and other major platforms. These engagements provided opportunities to explain government policies, address public concerns, counter misinformation and showcase development initiatives across multiple sectors.

According to official records, Cross River's national media visibility rose dramatically from approximately 28 percent in 2022 to about 78 percent by 2025, representing one of the most

significant improvements in government media presence in recent years.

Beyond publicity, the initiative strengthened transparency, improved policy communication and restored public confidence in government information.

One of the landmark achievements of the administration was the revival of the Ministry of Information's official website, www.moi.cr.gov.ng, which had remained inactive since 2015.

The restoration of the website was



accompanied by the establishment of official social media platforms on Facebook, Instagram and X (formerly Twitter), creating an integrated digital communication ecosystem capable of reaching citizens both within Nigeria and across the diaspora.

These platforms now provide timely updates on government activities, policy decisions, public announcements and developmental projects, ensuring that citizens receive information directly from official sources.

Government estimates indicate that the

digital platforms currently account for approximately 70 percent of the Ministry's publicity reach, with a target of increasing coverage to 95 percent by 2027 through full integration with the state's official digital platforms.

The daily publication and electronic distribution of government news bulletins to Ministries, Departments and Agencies have further strengthened real-time information dissemination and inter-agency communication.

One of the less publicised but highly significant reforms has been the



restoration of official government documentation.

For years, several statutory government publications had suffered irregular production, affecting record keeping and legal documentation.

The Otu administration reversed this trend through the commercial printing and publication of Government Gazettes, White Papers, Tender Journals and all enacted state laws, including the 2025 Appropriation Law.

These publications have strengthened

institutional memory, improved legal documentation, enhanced transparency and preserved important government decisions for future generations.

Similarly, the resumption and sustained production of official government bulletins since January 2023 has restored a vital information channel that had previously become inactive.

Another landmark achievement has been the revival of Giant Strides Magazine, the Ministry's flagship publication showcasing government projects, programmes and development



initiatives.

The magazine, which had not been published since July 2017, resumed publication in October 2023 and has remained consistent.

Within three years, seven editions have been completed, and more than 13,000 copies have been distributed across Nigeria.

Beyond public enlightenment, the publication now serves as an enduring documentary record of the Otu administration's developmental journey and a valuable archival resource for future generations.

Governor Otu's administration also demonstrated an appreciation for strategic storytelling as a tool for investment promotion and image building.

The production and nationwide broadcast of the documentary "Governor Otu @2" represented a significant milestone in government communication.

Aired on Channels Television, AIT, ARISE News, TVC, NTA and other national networks between May and June 2025, the documentary highlighted achievements across multiple sectors, projecting Cross River State to a nationwide audience and strengthening

investor confidence in the state's development agenda.

Combined with regular press briefings and sustained media engagements, these initiatives have ensured that government activities remain accessible, verifiable and visible.

While embracing digital communication, the administration equally recognised the importance of grassroots engagement.

Through sustained mass mobilisation campaigns, coordinated press releases, Information Officers deployed across Ministries, Departments and Agencies, and the Village Square Broadcast Programme, government information

reached communities that traditionally had limited access to digital media.

The Village Square initiative particularly strengthened communication with traditional institutions, promoted indigenous values and ensured that government policies were explained in culturally relevant ways.

This combination of digital innovation and community engagement has significantly expanded the reach of government communication across urban and rural communities alike.

CRBC's Digital Revolution

If the Ministry of Information experienced institutional renewal, the





Cross River Broadcasting Corporation underwent a complete technological transformation.

Over the last three years, CRBC evolved from a conventional broadcasting station into a modern multimedia organisation.

The Corporation introduced a fully paperless digital newsroom, enabling

real-time news production and significantly improving operational efficiency.

To guarantee uninterrupted broadcasting despite Nigeria's persistent power challenges, four television and radio studios were equipped with inverter systems, virtually eliminating on-air interruptions caused by electricity



outages.

Additional investments included the installation of a new 20/2-kilowatt radio transmitter, a 13KVA electrical substation, comprehensive remodelling of radio studios, reception areas, conference facilities and newsroom infrastructure, as well as the acquisition of a new operational vehicle.

These improvements have substantially enhanced staff productivity and broadcast quality.

Perhaps the most transformative

achievement at CRBC has been the expansion of its audience beyond traditional terrestrial broadcasting.

Television services were migrated to satellite and Free-to-Air platforms, while Radio Garden integration enabled global online radio streaming.

The launch of the Naija TV mobile application, migration to the GOtv platform and government-supported NIGOSAT carriage services further expanded access to Cross River programming.

Today, CRBC reaches audiences across more



than ten local government areas while simultaneously serving viewers and listeners across Nigeria and the international diaspora.

For the first time, Cross River's stories are being told simultaneously to local communities and global audiences.

Understanding the changing media landscape, has CRBC established a modern podcast studio through collaboration with diaspora media partners in the United States.

This initiative has opened new opportunities for digital content production while positioning the Corporation to compete within today's evolving multimedia environment.

Equally important was the expansion of indigenous language programming following the acquisition of National Broadcasting Commission thematic language licences.

Combined with tourism-focused programmes, these initiatives have strengthened cultural preservation while

promoting Cross River's rich heritage to wider audiences.

Strengthening Institutional Capacity

Beyond infrastructure and technology, the administration has invested heavily in institutional development.

Participation in national fora of Information Commissioners under the Progressive Governors' Forum has enhanced intergovernmental collaboration while improving policy coordination and professional networking.

The remarkable transformation recorded in the information sector has also attracted national recognition for the Honourable Commissioner for Information, Dr. Erasmus Ekpang, whose leadership has earned him several prestigious media and public communication awards from reputable professional bodies and organizations across the country. In further affirmation of Cross River State's growing influence in public communication, the Commissioner was unanimously elected Secretary of the Forum of Commissioners for Information in All Progressives Congress (APC)-governed states, a development widely regarded as a testament to the administration's innovative communication strategy, institutional reforms and outstanding

contributions to information management at both the state and national levels.

Coverage of major state ceremonies, including Democracy Day, Independence Day, Children's Day and anniversary celebrations of the People First Administration, has ensured that important moments in the state's history are professionally documented and preserved.

Meanwhile, the continued publication of over 173 editions of the Nigerian Chronicle and Weekend Chronicle has sustained the state's print media presence and enriched the historical archive of government activities.

Another significant milestone has been the near-completion of the comprehensive restoration of the Cross River State Newspaper Corporation complex, which was extensively vandalised and destroyed during the #EndSARS protests in 2020.

The rehabilitation of the corporation's facilities represents the administration's commitment to rebuilding critical public institutions and restoring the state's capacity for public information dissemination through its flagship newspapers.

In furtherance of this objective, the Otu administration has also procured modern digital printing equipment for the restoration of the Government Printing Press. When fully operational, the facility

will not only guarantee greater confidentiality in the printing of sensitive government documents, gazettes, white papers and other official publications, but will also position the state to generate additional revenue through commercial printing services for public and private organisations.

These complementary investments underscore Governor Otu's broader vision of rebuilding the entire government information value chain, from content creation and documentation to printing, publishing and distribution, while strengthening institutional self-reliance, improving operational efficiency and creating new economic opportunities within the information sector.

Ultimately, the achievements recorded in the information sector extend far beyond improved publicity.

They represent the deliberate construction of an open, digitally connected and citizen-focused governance system.

Through stronger communication channels, modern broadcasting infrastructure, revitalised institutional capacity, enhanced digital engagement, improved archival systems and broader media visibility, Governor Bassey Otu has repositioned information as a strategic instrument for development rather than merely a vehicle for publicity.

The reforms have strengthened transparency, increased citizen participation, expanded access to government information and restored confidence in public communication.

Three years after assuming office, Governor Bassey Edet Otu has transformed Cross River's information sector from a largely analogue, under-resourced system into a modern, technology-driven communication ecosystem.

From reviving dormant digital platforms and modernising government documentation to repositioning CRBC for global broadcasting and restoring Cross River's voice on the national media stage, the administration has demonstrated that effective governance depends as much on how government communicates as on what it delivers.

As the state advances toward deeper digital governance, broader citizen engagement and stronger institutional transparency, the reforms implemented between 2023 and 2026 have laid a durable foundation for an information sector that is not only more efficient and innovative but also better equipped to serve the people of Cross River State in the years ahead.

STEPS TO OBTAIN CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY IN CROSS RIVER STATE

- 1** Obtain an Application Form at CRGIA's Office, Old Secretariat Road, Off Murtala Mohammed Highway, Calabar, Cross River State
- 2** Submit Application Form with Required Documents
Fill and submit the form along with necessary documents, e.g. Registered Title Document, survey plan, identification, etc.
- 3** Assessment and Payment of Fees.
The office will assess applicable charges, registration fees, processing fees, etc. Make the required payment.
- 4** Inspection and Publication (for private land)
Property is inspected by LUAC officials
Notice of application is published for 21 days to allow for objections.
After clearance, Governor's Approval in Principle is obtained.
- 5** C of O (Certificate of Occupancy) Engrossment and Signing
The Certificate of Occupancy is prepared (engrossed) and signed by the Governor or delegated authority.
- 6** Registration and Delivery
Final registration is completed at the Lands Registry.
Registered documents are delivered to the applicant (client).
