Speaking at the event, Governor Otu described the occasion as an



opportunity to once again recognise excellence, hard work, commitment and ethical conduct as the hallmarks that have defined Chief Agabi, a worthy son of Cross River State, a patriot and a statesman, over the past 80 years.

The governor noted that Chief

Agabi, from humble beginnings, had braved considerable odds to shape society and, in particular, the legal profession, where he remains one of its most esteemed titans.

"As a Government and People of Cross River State, we continue to celebrate his place

in our history and the nation at large, and will not cease to seek his guidance and immense wisdom as we deliver on the People First Agenda," Governor Otu said.

He also used the occasion to remind the gathering that Nigeria is on the path of greatness,

Odey: Gov. Otu Administration Too Solid to Be Distracted by Opposition Politics



The Cross River State Deputy Governor, Rt. Hon. Peter Odey, has declared that the Governor Bassey Edet Otu-led administration remains focused and politically grounded, insisting that the government is “too solid to be

distracted” by opposition politics or social media criticisms.

Odey stated this when he received a delegation from the Creative, Entertainment and Events Community (CEEC), Cross River State, at the Deputy Governor’s Conference Room,

Government House, Calabar, on Thursday.

Reacting to recent comments attributed to a factional candidate of the opposition party in the state, Odey said the administration would rather allow its record in office to speak for itself



than be drawn into unnecessary political distractions.

According to him, the administration inherited a state that required deliberate restoration and has since embarked on the restoration, renovation and remodelling of critical state infrastructure and assets, while

simultaneously initiating new projects aimed at repositioning the state for sustainable growth.

He said the political strength of the All Progressives Congress (APC) in the state was rooted not merely in political structures, but also in the administration's visible interventions across sectors across the three

senatorial districts.

Rt. Hon. Odey cited improved security across the state as a major achievement of the administration, noting that the relative peace and stability have created a more conducive environment for businesses and private-sector investments to thrive, including in Akpabuyo, which



plays host to a university.

He also highlighted the implementation of the ₦70,000 minimum wage, noting that Cross River was among the first states in the country to commence implementation of the new wage regime in December 2024, while on the

welfare of senior citizens, Odey said the administration had made the welfare of retirees a priority, pointing to the release of ₦10 billion towards the settlement of outstanding gratuities, with the first batch already cleared and the second batch currently being processed.

He added that pension payments

remain a priority of the administration, stressing that government would continue to honour its obligations to workers and retirees, noting that no pensioner is currently owed pension in the state.

Odey therefore called on Cross Riverians, including members of the creative



community and political stakeholders, to look beyond partisan differences and contribute to the development of the state.

Speaking earlier, the spokesman of the CEEC delegation and DG-Central, CEEC, Mr. EJOR Ndifon, commended the Governor Otu-led administration for what he described as deliberate

efforts to improve the socioeconomic wellbeing of Cross Riverians and give critical state assets a facelift.

Speaking further, Ndifon commended the Governor Otu-led administration for its growing support for the creative arts and entertainment industry, noting that the government's deliberate efforts to create opportunities for young creatives are helping to

position the state as a destination for talent, entertainment and creative enterprise.

He particularly appreciated the administration's recognition of the creative sector as an important component of the state's socioeconomic development, stressing that sustained government support would enable more



young people to turn their talents into sustainable livelihoods.

Reaffirming the group's support for the administration ahead of the 2027 general elections, he expressed appreciation to the Deputy Governor, Rt. Hon. Peter Odey, for his consistent support for talents, young people and youth economic empowerment.

Ndifon disclosed

that, ahead of the official flag-off of CEEC, the group would stage a Creative Youth Mega Walk in solidarity with Governor Bassey Otu and Deputy Governor Peter Odey on Saturday, September 26.

He said the initiative would bring together young people within the creative, entertainment and events ecosystem to demonstrate their support for the administration's

efforts to create opportunities and strengthen the creative economy.

The high point of the visit was the presentation of a commemorative souvenir to the Deputy Governor by the Director of the group in the Southern Senatorial District, Mr. Bobby Ekanem.







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C'River Surpasses 2026 Energy Access Target by 5%

The Cross River State Government has surpassed its 2026 target for expanding access to electricity across rural and urban communities by five per cent, following sustained investments in

power infrastructure and renewable energy under the administration of Governor Senator Prince Bassey Edet Otu.

The achievement reflects the administration's efforts to address

longstanding electricity gaps through the expansion and rehabilitation of power infrastructure, as well as the deployment of renewable energy solutions to underserved

communities in line with its People First Agenda.

The Director General of the Cross River State Electrification Agency (CRSEA), Mr. Francis Ekpo, said the agency had intensified interventions aimed at extending electricity access to communities that had previously experienced inadequate or no access to grid

power.

Ekpo said the interventions included transformer installations and replacements, substation rehabilitation, network expansion, reticulation and fresh electrification projects across rural and urban communities.

He assured that the agency would sustain its efforts to

ensure that more Cross Riverians have access to affordable, reliable and sustainable electricity, noting that the ongoing projects were designed to strengthen existing infrastructure while opening up new areas for electrification.

According to Ekpo, the electrification programme has also moved beyond





conventional grid infrastructure, with the rollout of 10,000 solar home systems for rural households and small businesses.

He said the 2025 electricity project portfolio covered Calabar Municipality, Calabar South, Ogoja, Bekwarra, Akamkpa, Odukpani, Ikom and Yala, with interventions including transformer installations and replacements,

network rehabilitation, substation development and fresh electrification.

“For 2026, we have continued with major projects, including the replacement of a 500KVA transformer at Nsefik/Atekong in Calabar Municipality, a 500KVA substation at Unebu Community in Ugep and a 500KVA transformer project at Okuku in Yala,” Ekpo said.

He added that other interventions included a 1MVA transformer project at Ekorinim and additional projects targeting critical electricity infrastructure across metropolitan Calabar.

“These interventions are important in strengthening electricity supply in areas experiencing population growth and increased commercial activities, while our



rural projects are extending access to communities that have remained underserved,” Ekpo said.

Ekpo said the agency’s strategy combines grid expansion, infrastructure rehabilitation and renewable energy deployment, with the state targeting 65 per cent statewide

electricity access by 2027.

He said the progress recorded so far demonstrated the state government’s commitment to closing the energy access gap and providing the infrastructure required to support households, businesses and economic activities across Cross River.

The continued investment in electricity infrastructure and renewable energy, he added, would further strengthen the foundation for improved living standards, industrial development and sustainable economic growth across both rural and urban communities.

Framework (PMF) and Service Contract System.

The meeting, which brought together the Teaching Service Performance Management Committee and representatives of the Education Boards, focused on

the framework's objectives, structure, and proposed implementation.

The framework is designed to establish clear performance expectations, measurable Key Performance Indicators (KPIs),



periodic appraisals, and stronger accountability within the Teaching Service.

A key highlight of the engagement was a live demonstration of the Teaching Service Performance Management Application by the Technical Team.

The digital platform will facilitate electronic

appraisal, capture performance data and KPIs, review assessments, and generate reports for teachers, Head Teachers, Principals, Vice Principals, and other relevant personnel.

The Education Boards commended the initiative and expressed their readiness to collaborate with the Committee and Technical Team towards its

refinement and successful implementation.

The engagement represents another significant step towards a more structured, transparent, and technology-driven performance management system in the Cross River State Teaching Service.



CRGIA Partners Livestock Dept. to Build Digital Registration System



The Cross River Geographic Information Agency (CRGIA) is collaborating with the Office of the Special Adviser on Livestock Development to the Governor to build a Livestock Registration System using the Cross River

Geographic Information System (CRGIS).

Receiving the Special Adviser and his team in his office, the Director-General of CRGIA, Mr. William Archibong Jr., said CRGIA is not just about land management but also about

deploying geospatial intelligence to manage data across all sectors of the state for effective planning and policy formulation.

He noted that the collaboration, tagged "From Data to Development," will provide



accurate livestock information for better planning, healthier animals, stronger communities and a more prosperous Cross River State.

He also appreciated His Excellency, Sen. Prince Bassey Otu, for his support to the Agency through facility upgrade and technical backing, which has ensured the birth and survival of projects

such as this.

Speaking on the technical aspects, the Director of Operations, CRGIA, Mr. Jesam Iwara, emphasized that the Cross River Geographic Information System is the official geographic platform of Cross River State. Developed and managed by CRGIA, it is designed to collect, manage, analyse and visualise location-based information

for a smarter, safer and more prosperous Cross River State.

He stated that the Agency currently supports activities across the state through the application of geospatial intelligence in sectors such as the economy, environment, humanitarian services, security and agriculture, and is now extending its

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application to building a stronger livestock sector.

He highlighted that the collaboration will achieve digital registration of livestock, accurate location data, improved animal health and enhanced support for farmers and Value Chain Actors (VCAs).

In his remarks, the Special Adviser on Livestock Development to the Governor, Mr.

Liyel Imoukhuede, thanked the management of CRGIA for the technical expertise deployed for the collaboration.

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Gov Otu Celebrates Nigerian Editors, Calls for Media Commitment to Truth and Nation-Building



Cross River State Governor, Senator Bassey Edet Otu, has described editors as custodians of public truth and indispensable guardians of democracy, urging them to remain courageous,

ethical and steadfast in advancing Nigeria's development.

In a goodwill message to the Nigerian Guild of Editors on the occasion of its conference in Enugu State, Otu said the gathering represented "a

grand convergence of consciences, ideas, experience and patriotic commitment."

The governor, who conveyed the felicitations of the Government and people of Cross River State through his

Special Adviser on Media and Publicity and Chief uPress Secretary, Mr. Linus Obogo, noted that the conference went beyond a routine professional assembly.

"It is a coming together of the custodians of public truth, the sentinels of accountability, and the skilled hands that refine the first draft of history into a credible record for generations yet unborn," he stated.

Emphasising the strategic place of editors in nation-building, Otu said they occupy "a sacred place in the architecture of every thriving democracy."

According to him, editors operate at the crucial intersection of information and understanding, determining "not merely what the nation reads, but how it reflects, reasons and responds."

He praised the editorial profession for illuminating the public space through sound judgement, courage, balance and fidelity to facts.

"Through sound judgment, courage, balance and fidelity to fact, you illuminate the public square and help society separate substance from noise, truth from falsehood, and hope from despair," the governor said.

Otu observed that the conference was taking place at a consequential moment when Nigerians were seeking reassurance, direction and renewed confidence in the country's promise. While acknowledging that technology had expanded access to information, he warned that it had also "multiplied misinformation, sharpened division and tested the ethical foundations of journalism."

Against that background, the governor described the editor as "an indispensable



compass: calm amid turbulence, discerning amid confusion, and steadfast amid pressure."

He urged the Guild to formulate strategies for strengthening professional standards, protecting press freedom, rebuilding public trust, nurturing younger journalists and ensuring that technological innovation serves truth rather than undermines it.

"Nigeria needs an editorial community that remains fearless without becoming



reckless, critical without becoming cynical, and influential without surrendering its independence," Otu declared.

He added that Cross River State cherishes the press as "a vital partner in governance, social progress, peace-building, and the continuing work of perfecting our union," while saluting the Guild's leadership and members for their invaluable contributions to national development.

The Governor also commended the government and people of Enugu State for receiving



the editors with warmth and gracious hospitality, describing the Coal City as a fitting venue renowned for enterprise, learning, culture, resilience and political history.

Wishing the delegates fruitful deliberations and safe journeys, Otu prayed: "May every session kindle insight, every encounter build bridges, and every resolution enlarge the frontiers of truth, justice, unity and responsible citizenship."

CROSS RIVER COMMENCES STATEWIDE DISTRIBUTION OF IMPROVED COWPEA SEEDS

The Cross River State Ministry of Agriculture and Irrigation Development will commence the statewide distribution of improved SAMPEA 20-T PBR cowpea seeds, developed by the Institute for Agricultural Research (IAR), to interested farmers from Monday, September 21, 2026.

SAMPEA 20-T is an improved cowpea variety developed through agricultural research, with high genetic purity and resistance to the major pod-borer pest, *Maruca vitrata*. The variety is known for early maturity, improved yield performance and reduced dependence on insecticide applications compared with susceptible conventional varieties.

The intervention is aimed at increasing cowpea production, strengthening food security and improving access to nutritious food, particularly for women and children, while enhancing farmers' productivity and livelihoods.

Distribution will be carried out in collaboration with the State Chapters of the Cowpea Farmers Association and Women in Agriculture (WIA).

Interested farmers are required to proceed to their respective Local Government Councils for documentation and collection of the improved seeds.

Farmers are advised to adhere strictly to the designated collection arrangements. The seeds are solely for planting purposes and are not for human consumption.

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CR-SACA Strengthens Gender and Human Rights Response at Quarterly Stakeholders' Engagement

The Cross River State Agency for the Control of AIDS (CRSACA) has held its quarterly Gender and Human Rights State Response Team meeting to review issues affecting gender and human rights and strengthen the state's response.

The meeting, held at the CRSACA Conference Hall in Calabar, brought together representatives of relevant government agencies, civil society organisations and partners, including ECEWS, NEPWHAN, CCRN, National Orientation Agency (NOA), Child

Protection Network, Nigeria Police Force, Heartland Alliance, NDLEA, human rights groups and other stakeholders.

The meeting, which formed part of the activities of the Technical Working Group, provided an opportunity for stakeholders to



review issues within the gender and human rights response and contribute towards improving coordination and interventions in the state.

The session was anchored by Mr. Okanke Obase, who coordinated the discussions and gave participants the opportunity to make inputs on the issues presented.

Participants made contributions and recommendations on areas requiring attention, with discussions focusing on improved coordination, communication, information sharing, reporting and collaboration among stakeholders.

They also stressed the need for effective referral mechanisms, proper documentation of relevant

organisations and focal persons, and stronger communication among members to ensure that information and agreed actions reach all relevant stakeholders.

The meeting provided a platform for participants to share perspectives and propose practical steps towards addressing identified gaps and



strengthening the collective response to gender and human rights issues in Cross River State.

In his closing remarks, the Director-General of CRSACA, Dr. Charles Iwara, who was represented by the Agency's Monitoring and Evaluation Officer, Mr. John Eseiwara, thanked stakeholders for

attending the meeting and for their active participation and valuable contributions.

Mr. Eseiwara appreciated their continued commitment to the gender and human rights response and encouraged them to sustain collaboration towards achieving the objectives of the State Response Team.

The meeting ended with a renewed commitment by stakeholders to strengthen collaboration, communication and coordinated action in advancing gender and human rights interventions across Cross River State.

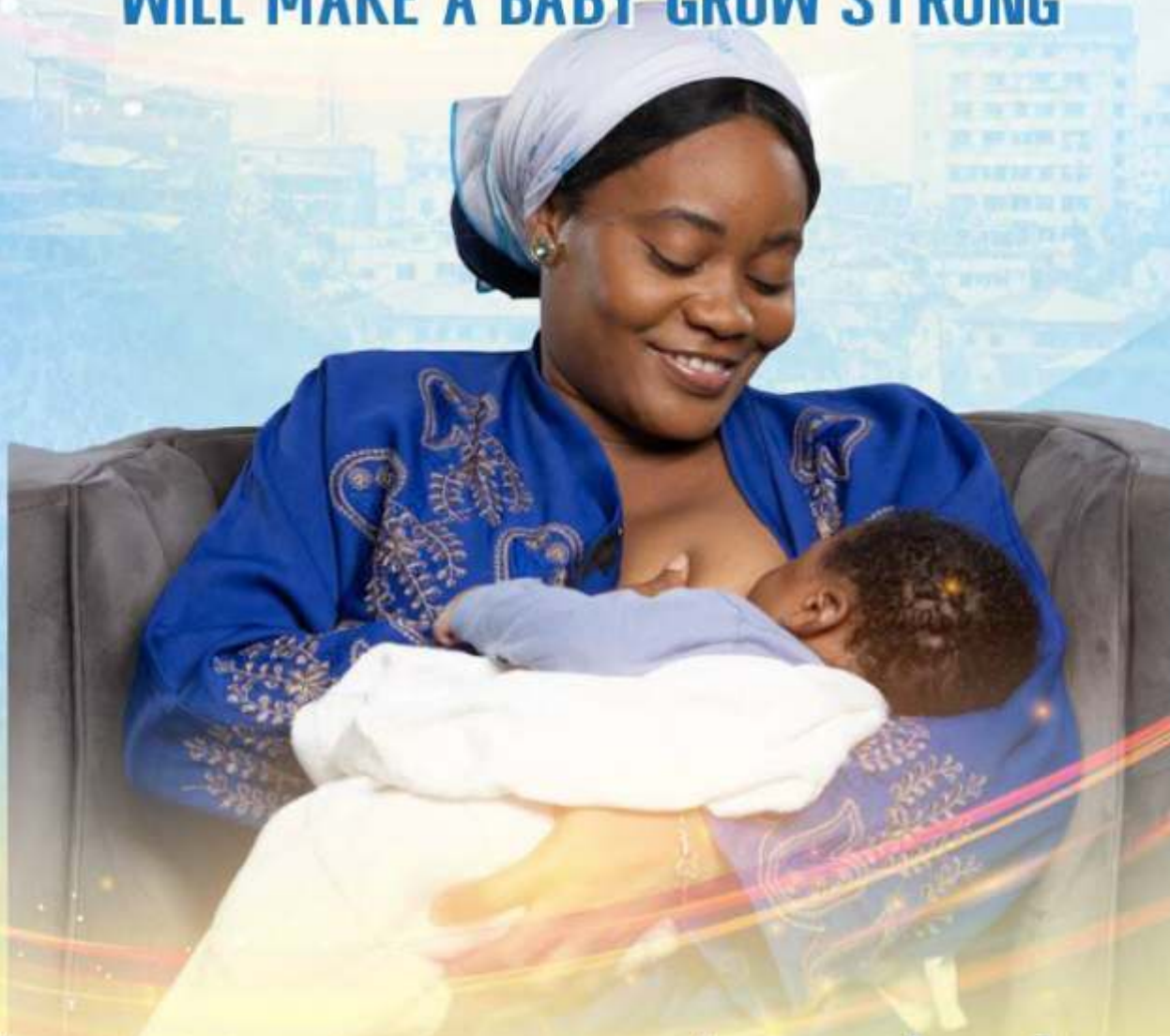

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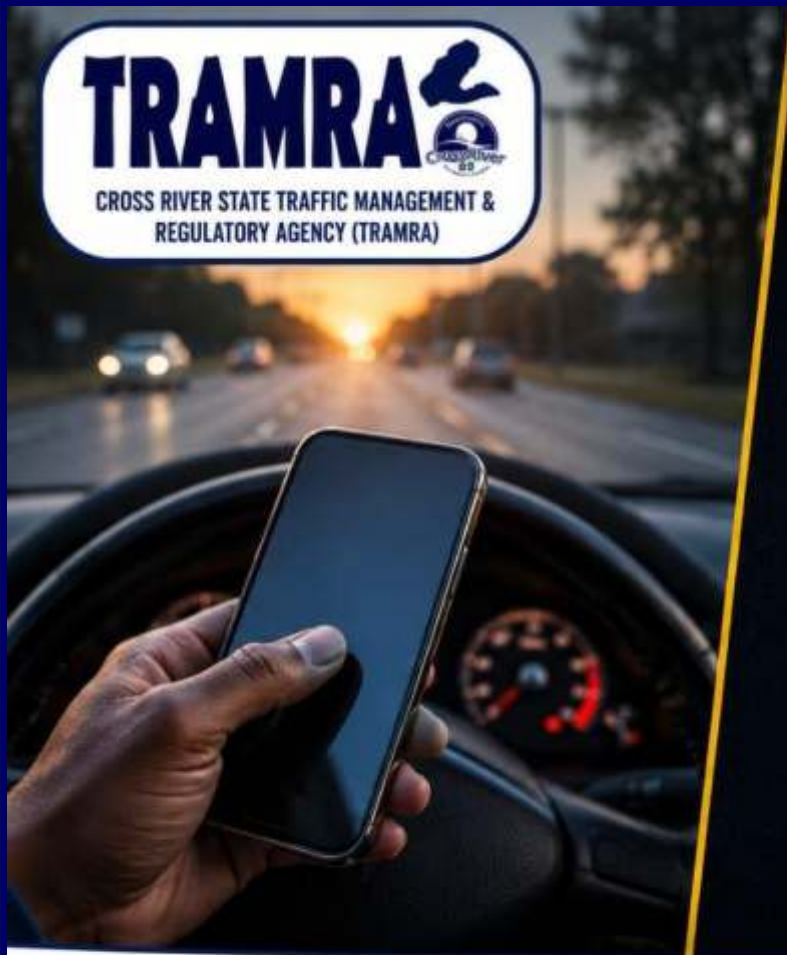

EXTENSION OF THE SUSPENSION OF ALL SCRAP-RELATED ACTIVITIES IN CROSS RIVER STATE

Further to the Press Release dated the 23rd of February 2026, communicating His Excellency, Senator Prince Bassey Edet Otu's approval of the suspension of all scrap-related activities, the Cross River State Government hereby notifies the general public that the suspension has been extended for a further period of one (1) month expiring on the 23rd August 2026.

As stated in the previous Press Release, the suspension was necessitated by the increasing incidents of vandalism, theft and destruction of public infrastructure by scavengers, scrap dealers and their agents, and the significant security threat posed to the State. This extension is intended to enable Government conclude the ongoing review of the laws, policies and regulatory framework governing scrap-related activities in Cross River State. The objective is to strengthen the regulatory regime, identify and protect legitimate operators, and implement measures that effectively prevent the infiltration of criminal elements into the sector.

Government regrets any inconvenience caused to legitimate businesses and law-abiding operators. However, the protection of public infrastructure, the preservation of public order and security remain paramount. Members of the general public are accordingly informed that the suspension remains in full force and that any person or organization found engaging in scrap-related activities in contravention of this directive shall be dealt with strictly in accordance with the law.

INFORMATION SECTOR

Gov. Otu: Repositioning Cross River's Information Sector for Transparency, Digital Governance, Global Visibility

Information is the lifeblood of governance. It shapes public perception, inspires confidence, preserves history and connects government with the governed. Recognising this reality, Governor Bassey

Edet Otu made the revitalisation of Cross River State's information ecosystem a strategic component of his People First Agenda, transforming what had long been regarded as a routine government communication apparatus



into a dynamic instrument for transparency, citizen engagement and institutional efficiency.

Three years into the administration, the information sector has emerged as one of the state's most improved sectors, recording remarkable progress in digital transformation, public communication, media relations, broadcasting, institutional strengthening and archival documentation. The reforms implemented between 2023 and 2026 have not only modernised government information management but have also significantly enhanced Cross River

State's visibility on the national and international stage.

Prior to 2023, many of the structures responsible for government information management had suffered years of neglect. Critical communication infrastructure was outdated, public engagement had diminished, digital platforms were inactive, and the Ministry of Information operated with severe manpower and technological limitations.

Governor Otu's administration responded with deliberate investments





aimed at rebuilding the Ministry into a modern public communication institution capable of meeting the demands of contemporary governance.

For the first time in well over a decade, the Ministry underwent comprehensive institutional revitalisation. Modern ICT equipment was procured, digital workflows introduced, and office operations significantly improved through technology-driven systems. Equally significant was the recruitment of 20 new personnel (information officers), ending a manpower deficit that had persisted for more than 13 years and injecting fresh capacity into government information management.

These reforms improved operational efficiency while

laying the foundation for a more responsive and professional information service.

Perhaps one of the administration's most visible achievements has been the deliberate repositioning of Cross River State within the national media landscape.

Under Governor Otu, the Commissioner for



Information maintained consistent appearances on leading national television networks including Channels Television, AIT, ARISE News, TVC, NTA and other major platforms. These engagements provided opportunities to explain government policies, address public concerns, counter misinformation and showcase development initiatives across multiple sectors.

According to official records, Cross River's national media visibility rose dramatically from approximately 28 percent in 2022 to about 78 percent by 2025, representing one of the most

significant improvements in government media presence in recent years.

Beyond publicity, the initiative strengthened transparency, improved policy communication and restored public confidence in government information.

One of the landmark achievements of the administration was the revival of the Ministry of Information's official website, www.moi.cr.gov.ng, which had remained inactive since 2015.

The restoration of the website was



accompanied by the establishment of official social media platforms on Facebook, Instagram and X (formerly Twitter), creating an integrated digital communication ecosystem capable of reaching citizens both within Nigeria and across the diaspora.

These platforms now provide timely updates on government activities, policy decisions, public announcements and developmental projects, ensuring that citizens receive information directly from official sources.

Government estimates indicate that the

digital platforms currently account for approximately 70 percent of the Ministry's publicity reach, with a target of increasing coverage to 95 percent by 2027 through full integration with the state's official digital platforms.

The daily publication and electronic distribution of government news bulletins to Ministries, Departments and Agencies have further strengthened real-time information dissemination and inter-agency communication.

One of the less publicised but highly significant reforms has been the



restoration of official government documentation.

For years, several statutory government publications had suffered irregular production, affecting record keeping and legal documentation.

The Otu administration reversed this trend through the commercial printing and publication of Government Gazettes, White Papers, Tender Journals and all enacted state laws, including the 2025 Appropriation Law.

These publications have strengthened

institutional memory, improved legal documentation, enhanced transparency and preserved important government decisions for future generations.

Similarly, the resumption and sustained production of official government bulletins since January 2023 has restored a vital information channel that had previously become inactive.

Another landmark achievement has been the revival of Giant Strides Magazine, the Ministry's flagship publication showcasing government projects, programmes and development



initiatives.

The magazine, which had not been published since July 2017, resumed publication in October 2023 and has remained consistent.

Within three years, seven editions have been completed, and more than 13,000 copies have been distributed across Nigeria.

Beyond public enlightenment, the publication now serves as an enduring documentary record of the Otu administration's developmental journey and a valuable archival resource for future generations.

Governor Otu's administration also demonstrated an appreciation for strategic storytelling as a tool for investment promotion and image building.

The production and nationwide broadcast of the documentary "Governor Otu @2" represented a significant milestone in government communication.

Aired on Channels Television, AIT, ARISE News, TVC, NTA and other national networks between May and June 2025, the documentary highlighted achievements across multiple sectors, projecting Cross River State to a nationwide audience and strengthening

investor confidence in the state's development agenda.

Combined with regular press briefings and sustained media engagements, these initiatives have ensured that government activities remain accessible, verifiable and visible.

While embracing digital communication, the administration equally recognised the importance of grassroots engagement.

Through sustained mass mobilisation campaigns, coordinated press releases, Information Officers deployed across Ministries, Departments and Agencies, and the Village Square Broadcast Programme, government information

reached communities that traditionally had limited access to digital media.

The Village Square initiative particularly strengthened communication with traditional institutions, promoted indigenous values and ensured that government policies were explained in culturally relevant ways.

This combination of digital innovation and community engagement has significantly expanded the reach of government communication across urban and rural communities alike.

CRBC's Digital Revolution

If the Ministry of Information experienced institutional renewal, the





Cross River Broadcasting Corporation underwent a complete technological transformation.

Over the last three years, CRBC evolved from a conventional broadcasting station into a modern multimedia organisation.

The Corporation introduced a fully paperless digital newsroom, enabling

real-time news production and significantly improving operational efficiency.

To guarantee uninterrupted broadcasting despite Nigeria's persistent power challenges, four television and radio studios were equipped with inverter systems, virtually eliminating on-air interruptions caused by electricity



outages.

Additional investments included the installation of a new 20/2-kilowatt radio transmitter, a 13KVA electrical substation, comprehensive remodelling of radio studios, reception areas, conference facilities and newsroom infrastructure, as well as the acquisition of a new operational vehicle.

These improvements have substantially enhanced staff productivity and broadcast quality.

Perhaps the most transformative

achievement at CRBC has been the expansion of its audience beyond traditional terrestrial broadcasting.

Television services were migrated to satellite and Free-to-Air platforms, while Radio Garden integration enabled global online radio streaming.

The launch of the Naija TV mobile application, migration to the GOtv platform and government-supported NIGOSAT carriage services further expanded access to Cross River programming.

Today, CRBC reaches audiences across more



than ten local government areas while simultaneously serving viewers and listeners across Nigeria and the international diaspora.

For the first time, Cross River's stories are being told simultaneously to local communities and global audiences.

Understanding the changing media landscape, has CRBC established a modern podcast studio through collaboration with diaspora media partners in the United States.

This initiative has opened new opportunities for digital content production while positioning the Corporation to compete within today's evolving multimedia environment.

Equally important was the expansion of indigenous language programming following the acquisition of National Broadcasting Commission thematic language licences.

Combined with tourism-focused programmes, these initiatives have strengthened cultural preservation while

promoting Cross River's rich heritage to wider audiences.

Strengthening Institutional Capacity

Beyond infrastructure and technology, the administration has invested heavily in institutional development.

Participation in national fora of Information Commissioners under the Progressive Governors' Forum has enhanced intergovernmental collaboration while improving policy coordination and professional networking.

The remarkable transformation recorded in the information sector has also attracted national recognition for the Honourable Commissioner for Information, Dr. Erasmus Ekpang, whose leadership has earned him several prestigious media and public communication awards from reputable professional bodies and organizations across the country. In further affirmation of Cross River State's growing influence in public communication, the Commissioner was unanimously elected Secretary of the Forum of Commissioners for Information in All Progressives Congress (APC)-governed states, a development widely regarded as a testament to the administration's innovative communication strategy, institutional reforms and outstanding

contributions to information management at both the state and national levels.

Coverage of major state ceremonies, including Democracy Day, Independence Day, Children's Day and anniversary celebrations of the People First Administration, has ensured that important moments in the state's history are professionally documented and preserved.

Meanwhile, the continued publication of over 173 editions of the Nigerian Chronicle and Weekend Chronicle has sustained the state's print media presence and enriched the historical archive of government activities.

Another significant milestone has been the near-completion of the comprehensive restoration of the Cross River State Newspaper Corporation complex, which was extensively vandalised and destroyed during the #EndSARS protests in 2020.

The rehabilitation of the corporation's facilities represents the administration's commitment to rebuilding critical public institutions and restoring the state's capacity for public information dissemination through its flagship newspapers.

In furtherance of this objective, the Otu administration has also procured modern digital printing equipment for the restoration of the Government Printing Press. When fully operational, the facility

will not only guarantee greater confidentiality in the printing of sensitive government documents, gazettes, white papers and other official publications, but will also position the state to generate additional revenue through commercial printing services for public and private organisations.

These complementary investments underscore Governor Otu's broader vision of rebuilding the entire government information value chain, from content creation and documentation to printing, publishing and distribution, while strengthening institutional self-reliance, improving operational efficiency and creating new economic opportunities within the information sector.

Ultimately, the achievements recorded in the information sector extend far beyond improved publicity.

They represent the deliberate construction of an open, digitally connected and citizen-focused governance system.

Through stronger communication channels, modern broadcasting infrastructure, revitalised institutional capacity, enhanced digital engagement, improved archival systems and broader media visibility, Governor Bassey Otu has repositioned information as a strategic instrument for development rather than merely a vehicle for publicity.

The reforms have strengthened transparency, increased citizen participation, expanded access to government information and restored confidence in public communication.

Three years after assuming office, Governor Bassey Edet Otu has transformed Cross River's information sector from a largely analogue, under-resourced system into a modern, technology-driven communication ecosystem.

From reviving dormant digital platforms and modernising government documentation to repositioning CRBC for global broadcasting and restoring Cross River's voice on the national media stage, the administration has demonstrated that effective governance depends as much on how government communicates as on what it delivers.

As the state advances toward deeper digital governance, broader citizen engagement and stronger institutional transparency, the reforms implemented between 2023 and 2026 have laid a durable foundation for an information sector that is not only more efficient and innovative but also better equipped to serve the people of Cross River State in the years ahead.

STEPS TO OBTAIN CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY IN CROSS RIVER STATE

- 1** Obtain an Application Form at CRGIA's Office, Old Secretariat Road, Off Murtala Mohammed Highway, Calabar, Cross River State
- 2** Submit Application Form with Required Documents
Fill and submit the form along with necessary documents, e.g. Registered Title Document, survey plan, identification, etc.
- 3** Assessment and Payment of Fees.
The office will assess applicable charges, registration fees, processing fees, etc. Make the required payment.
- 4** Inspection and Publication (for private land)
Property is inspected by LUAC officials
Notice of application is published for 21 days to allow for objections.
After clearance, Governor's Approval in Principle is obtained.
- 5** C of O (Certificate of Occupancy) Engrossment and Signing
The Certificate of Occupancy is prepared (engrossed) and signed by the Governor or delegated authority.
- 6** Registration and Delivery
Final registration is completed at the Lands Registry.
Registered documents are delivered to the applicant (client).
